construction works at Indira Maidanam in the city on Saturday, expressed her displeasure over the inordinate delay in completion of works.

The construction of the Indoor Stadium taken up by the Corporation under the Smart City project for providing facilities for sportsmen with an outlay of Rs 7 crore, was scheduled to be completed a year back.

Despite repeated reminders by the Commissioner during her inspections, the works are dragging on resulting in the Commissioner again reprimanding the contractor for failure to complete the works.

Directing the officials concerned to accelerate the work, the Commissioner warned that appropriate action will be taken against the contract if

the works are further delayed.

The contractor assured the commissioner that he would complete the works by April-end.

The facilities in the centrally located stadium which include Shuttle, Kabadi, Basketball courts and also gymnasium will be a boon to the youth particularly sports persons and would go a long

way in promoting sports and games in the city, the Commissioner said adding that efforts were on to bring the stadium ready for public use as early as possible.

Along with Commissioner, Municipal Superintendent Engineer Tirumalika Mohan, Municipal Engineer Chandrasekar and Balaji were present.

HONOUR KILLING

Man kills daughter over love affair

A horrific incident of honour killing came to light at Alamur village in Panyam mandal of Nandyal district on Saturday.

According to information, one Devender Reddy, who lost his wife was living with his two daughters at Alamur village.

Two years ago, he performed his eldest daughter Prasanna's marriage with a software engineer and a resident of Jillala village in Gopadu mandal in Nandyal district.

After marriage the couple is living in Hyderabad. Two months ago, Prasanna came to Alamur and was staying with her father and sister. Despite Devender making efforts to send her back to her husband, Prasanna was disin-

terested. Then Devender began to suspect the behaviour of Prasanna.

However, he came to know that Prasanna was in an affair with a person of another caste that's why she did not want to join her husband in Hyderabad.

Unable to digest Prasanna's affair with another caste person, Devender on February 10 strangled her to death.

Taking the help of his friends, he took the body of Prasanna in a car and dumped it in Giddalur forest area.

Prior to throwing, Devendra Reddy made the body into two pieces, separated the head from body and threw the two parts at various places.

Later he came home and pretending as if he was an innocent.

The incident came to light

when the deceased grandfather failed to contact Prasanna over phone. Suspecting something went wrong, he came to Alamur and asked about the whereabouts of Prasanna with Devender Reddy.

After getting irrelevant replies from Devender Reddy, Prasanna's grandfather filed a complaint with Panyam police station.

Based on the complaint the police filed a case under section 302 on the deceased father Devendr Reddy and took up investigation.

The source stated that the accused has been taken into custody and were searching for the body parts in the forest area.

Panyam Sub Inspector Sudhakar Reddy said that the body parts have been recovered and sent them for post-mortem.
