ADDRESSING the first meeting of the Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors under India's G20 Presidency via video message on Thursday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the creation of an inclusive agenda is essential to tide over the varied issues affecting

'Global economic leadership can win back the confidence of the world only by creating an inclusive agenda," the Prime Minister reiterated.

Kept on sedatives for over 24 hours, jumbo released in Coimbatore forest

THE 45-year-old makhna elephant captured near Coimbatore on Thursday spent over 24 hours on a truck while the forest department drove it 200 km to find a place for it to be freed as public at two sites protested its release in their localities.

Sources said the animal was sedated multiple times, raising concerns about its health. At 8.30 pm on Friday the animal fell as it was unloaded, sources said. Forest secretary Supriya Sahu at 10.30 pm told TNIE: "Elephant was released successfully deep inside reserve forest between Manombally-Varakaliyar. Elephant is healthy at time of release. It has moved to nearby check dam to drink water. Two teams of six people each with doctors are monitoring the elephant.'

Earlier, Chief Wildlife Warden Srinivas R Reddy denied any deterioration in the elephant's health. "Water was poured on it periodically and its health was monitored." he said. The problematic jumbo was moved to Varakaliyar in Anaimalai Tiger Reserve on February 6. However, it started

Student suicide: PG medico forced seniors, juniors to 'boycott' Preethi

KAKATIYA Medical College (KMC) second-year post-graduate student Md Saif was formally arrested by the Mattewada police on Friday. He allegedly started harassing Dharawath Preethi since December 2022, a month after she joined PG Anaesthesia. She allegedly attempted suicide due to harassment by her senior in MGM Hospital in Warangal.

According to Warangal Commissioner of Police A V Ranganath, Saif was shifted to Khammam Jail after being produced before the IIIrd Judicial First Class Magistrate in Warangal. Disclosing the details to the media, Ranganath stated that there was a culture of senior students bullying their juniors in KMC like in other medical colleges. Citing an example of asking him the reason for inbullying, the CP said that senior students insisted on their juniors addressing the former as 'Sir' and Saif particularly targeted Preethi with his highhanded behaviour. His harassment grew after Preethi pointed out Saif's negli-

gence in properly inserting an endotracheal tube in a patient in MGM Hospital, said Ranganath. Saif also made fun of

the mistakes made by Preethi in preparing the caresheet of a patient during her visit to the Government Maternity Hospital on February 20. He posted it on the WhatsApp group of the PG students of the college with an intention to insult her.

Feeling humiliated by this, Preethi sent a message to Saif,

sulting her on a public domain. She warned him to mind his own business and asked him to complain to the Head of the Department (HOD) or the principal if there was any mistake on her part. Further enraged by

fellow students not to extend cooperation to Preethi. Seniors as well as juniors started staying away from Preethi during duty hours. It was a kind of a boycott. Preethi's appeal to them to

Retd SC judge Nazeer takes oath as AP governor

FORMER judge of the Supreme Court Justice S Abdul Nazeer was sworn in as the Governor of Andhra Pradesh on Friday.

In the formal swearing-in ceremony, High Court Chief Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra administered the oath of office and secrecy to Justice (Retd) Nazeer.

The swearing-in-ceremony commenced at 9.30 am with Chief Secretary KS Jawahar Reddy reading out the warrant of appointment issued by the President of India. After the swearing-in-ceremony, Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Red-

dy, Chief Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra and other dignitaries greeted the Governor and presented bouquets to him.

Chairman of AP Legislative Council K Moshen Raju, all the Cabinet Ministers, Leader of Opposition N Chandrababu Naidu, MPs, MLAs, MLCs, several serving and retired judges of the Supreme Court, Andhra Pradesh High Court, Karnataka High Court, chairmen of various corporations, several public representatives, senior officers of the government, family members of the Governor, officials and non-officials attended the ceremony. Nazeer retired on January 4, 2023.

CLIMATE CHANGE

As mercury soars, people urged to take precautions

IT'S not yet March, but the mercury levels in the state have already started soaring high, signalling the onset of summer. In view of the rise in temperature, the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) has issued an advisory, urging people to maintain extreme caution.

The authority has asked the public to avoid direct sunlight between 11am and 3pm as chances of heat-related events, including sunstroke and sun-

burns, are high. The state has been experiencing unusually hot climate this year, with the average temperature in February hovering between 35 and 38 degree Celsius. The KSDMA has come up with the advisory even before the official announcement of the arrival of summer by the



India Meteorological Department (IMD). The automatic weather stations installed across the state are showing high temperatures everyday, prompting the authorities to come out with advisories.

The KSDMA has also warned of wildfires and advised people living close to forest areas to be on alert and to strictly comply with the warnings of the forest department. The authority has also recommended fire audits at marketplaces, buildings and garbage dumps that are vulnerable to fire. It has warned the public to use water responsibly and avoid unnecessary wastage, and to carry a bottle of water always to avoid dehydration.

The authority also advised educational institutions to avoid assemblies and rearrange the timings of such events to avoid the sun.

The curious case of Munnar

While the day time temperature has been soaring across Kerala, the rolling hills of Munnar have been witnessing an unusual climate. The mercury dips to zero degree Celsius during early morning hours, while

temperature shoots up to 25 degree Celsius by noon. "It is extremely hot during afternoon and the temperature plunges to zero degree Celsius by 5am. The night time temperature is expected to rise in the coming days," said an official at Kannan Devan Hill Plantations Ltd.
