Allow para forces for security: Lady Hardinge doctors

THE decision by Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya to remove security personnel from the Centre-run Lady Hardinge Medical College (LHMC) was denounced by the medical fraternity which has now demanded him to deploy Central reserve forces at public hospitals to ensure security of doctors - who often face hostility from the patient side.

Irked with the decision, the doctors, who are concerned for their safety sans bouncers and marshals, on Wednesday demanded the Centre to provide them paramilitary forces for security cover in the hospital.

"We respect Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya for being proactive in reforming the healthcare system. Yesterday, he removed bouncers and marshals from security of LHMC while personally having full blown security. We demand deployment of CRPF in the hospital," the resident doctors association of Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) hospital said, which is next in the line where the removal of private security is likely to be emulated.

The reaction came after on health ministry's directions, LHMC administration termi-

nated the services of marshals and bouncers employed in its campus. Sources said that the move came after the minister expressed displeasure from the presence of heavy security arrangements which he believed intimidated the patients.

The Federation of Resident Doctors Association (FORDA) also asked for "paramilitary forces" at the hospitals.

"Workplace security for healthcare workers is a burning issue. To deter violence against doctors, we need security personnel. If the minister thinks that bouncers are not appropriate, the same should be replaced by reinforcing with paramilitary forces and police forces," Dr Aviral Mathur, president, FORDA, said.

Dr Manish Jangra, chief advisor, Federation of All India Medical Association (FAIMA), said the removal of bouncers will push a rise in violence against doctors. "The whole system is such that everyone tries to find fault in the doctors. We are the ones who work in the face of hostility from patient attendants. To avert this, hospitals are forced to take services of bouncers. Their removal will push assault cases against medics which are now under control," he stated.

EV charging stations set up in Delhi Cantt

New Delhi: Charging points for electric vehicles were inaugurated at Delhi Cantonment on Wednesday. All the chargers are operational now, said a TPDDL statement. The chargers will be used for vehicles of Army and the employees living here.

Narela fire: Juvenile succumbs to burns

New Delhi: A 17-year-old boy, who had suffered burns in a fire at a factory in Narela area in Delhi that claimed two lives a day ago, succumbed at a hospital here, police said on Wednesday. The owner of the factory has also been arrested in the case, they said. "Sameer succumbed to the injuries at a hospital here. The owner of the factory, Sahil Garg (30), a resident of Pitampura, has been arrested," a senior police officer said.

5 Uzbek women go missing from shelter home



FIVE women, who are allegedly trafficked from Uzbekistan, went missing under mysterious circumstances from a private shelter home.

The incident happened a few days after the women had managed to escape and get an FIR registered at the Chanakyapuri police station on August 28.

The women were found to be missing from the shelter home, where they were shifted after lodging the FIR. Seven Uzbek women had informed the police about their ordeal of how they were trafficked and forced into prostitution. They had named 10 accused in their FIR, however, the police had nabbed only three accused till now.



After five out of the seven girls were reported to be missing, the Delhi Commission for Women issued summons to the Deputy Commissioner of Police of the New Delhi district.

The women were brought to Delhi via Nepal and some directly to India on tourist and medical visas. The women alleged that those who were brought to India via Nepal, their passports and other documents were taken away in that country

ments were taken away in that country, while the documents of other women were taken away by traffickers after arriving in India, the DCW said. The women alleged that they were forced into "prostitution" in India and were threatened and beaten when they resisted, the panel said. The women were told that

they would be caught and put in jail. They stated that they were sold to different owners during their stay in Delhi and were "raped" repeatedly, the panel added.

The DCW asked the police to ask for action taken to report the matter. The Commission has sought a copy of the FIR.

"Seven Uzbek girls had exposed a big international racket involving trafficking and sex slavery. Delhi Police registered an FIR but all accused were not arrested and the girls' passports were not recovered from the traffickers. With great difficulty and after going through an ordeal, these girls managed to escape. The girls had alleged that the traffickers had followed them with a gun as well! Now, five of the seven girls have gone missing from the shelter home," said DCW chief Swati Maliwal.

HC asks Delhi Police to trace Ukrainian son, Indian ex-husband on mom's plea

HEARING a petition of a Ukrainian woman, the High Court on Wednesday directed Delhi Police to trace her ex-husband who is from India and her three-year-old Ukrainian son.

The woman, in her petition, claimed that her son had been illegally brought to India during the ongoing Ukraine-Russia war. The HC issued notice to the ministries of home and external affairs, Delhi Police and the man in this regard.

The petitioner informed the court that she and her ex-husband were divorced in 2021. She claimed that despite the minor's custody was granted to her by a court there, the man took their son away without informing her. A bench comprising Justice Siddharth Mridul and Justice Amit Sharma said, "The first priority is to locate your son. We will hear you thereafter. We will ask further questions if needed, once your son is located."

'Son was kidnapped'

The petitioner said that her minor son was kidnapped by her ex-husband on March 23 when he had taken the child for a walk and did not return. After their separation, the man was granted visitation rights of their minor son

ing Justice Siddharth Mridul and Justice Amit Sharma said, "The first priority is to locate your son. We will hear you thereafter. We will ask further questions if needed, once your son is located."

The High Court granted time to the counsel for the Centre and the Delhi government to seek instructions in the matter and listed the matter for fur-

ther hearing on November 14. "You only need to tell us if they (man and son) have entered India," the bench told central government standing counsel Ajay Dignpaul, representing the Ministry of External Affairs.

It further said, "In the meantime, the Delhi Police is directed to locate the man and the three-year-old minor son and request them to appear before this court at the earliest."

Since the woman said that the man was sighted somewhere in Assam and Bihar, the HC told her counsel that when you have information that he is in Guwahati, why you did not move to Gauhati High Court. Now, Delhi Police will be hard pressed to locate them. It is your own case that he is sighted in Assam or Bihar and you are moving to Delhi HC.

Four mahila mohalla clinics opened, says CM

CHIEF Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday announced that 100 special mohalla clinics for women will be opened in the national capital and said these will be run by an all women staff. Inaugurating four 'mahila special mohalla clinics', he said children below 12 years and women will get free of cost treatment at these facilities.

The mohalla clinic system, a flagship initiative of the Kejriwal government, is aimed at boosting primary healthcare in the city, and according to the Outcome Budget presented in the assembly on March 25, on an average, one mohalla clinic handles 116 patients a day and together 520 these facilities have over 60,000 patients a day.

"Four mahila mohalla clinics, special clinics for women where gynaecological services,



tests and medicines will be available free of cost for them and children under the age of 12 years, are being opened today. In the first phase, 100 such facilities will be opened for women and children," the chief minister said.

Tests integrated

In addition to the 239 tests done at mohalla clinics, all tests for women, adolescents will be done at these new facilities, said CM Arvind Kejriwal. The first four clinics have been started at Basti Vikas Kendra JJ Camp, Moti Lal Nehru Camp in Munirka, Sector-4 DIZ, Sapera Basti in Kondli and DJB Sewage Pumping Station in Okhla

The chief minister, however, did not comment on a timeline on the opening of these clinics. "It was felt that there needed to be some facilities that are exclusively for women and therefore, based on the needs of women in Delhi, such facilities

are being opened on a large-scale," he said after the inauguration ceremony at the mahila mohalla clinic developed at the DIZ Staff Quarters in the Kali Mandir area.

The first four clinics have been started at Basti Vikas Kendra JJ Camp, Moti Lal Nehru Camp in Munirka, Sector-4 DIZ area, Sapera Basti in Kondli and DJB Sewage Pumping Station in Okhla.

"This mahila mohalla clinic model is the first of its kind innovation in our country. Only women and children aged under 12 will be treated at mahila mohalla clinics. All employees at these clinics will be females and like normal mohalla clinics, all treatment will be free of cost here," Kejriwal said. In addition to the 239 tests done at mohalla clinics, all tests related to women and adolescent healthcare will be done at these new facilities, he said.
