RISE in dengue cases worries parents in Gadag town and rural areas. Gadag witnessed 87 confirmed cases and 1,107 suspected cases from mid-July and August.

Now, health department officials have started an awareness campaign and are visiting both rural and urban areas in the district to control dengue fever.

MOBILE PHONE EFFECT 5.8k kids suffer due to eye issues in Ballari

AS a result of online classes and mobile addiction, more than 5,800 students have been suffering from eye-related problems in Ballari district. The health department came to know about this during their eye check-up drive in schools colleges.

Dr Veerendra Kumar, district officer for control of blindness, said they conducted eye check-up camps across the district, especially for children and youngsters. "We were shocked after we found eye-related problems among 5,800 children out of 33,000 students. It is mainly due to continuous watching of mobile devices," he pointed out.

After the Covid-19 pandemic broke out in the country, schools and colleges were declared holidays and to cover the pending syllabus, online classes were started. For over a year, students studied via online classes only. Parents, as they were left with no other option, bought smartphones for their kids. As the pandemic came under control, offline classes resumed and the children returned to schools. However, their addiction to the electronic gadget continued and they did not quit using phones.

"It appears that using mobile phone has become a habit among some students. Now they are suffering from eye-related problems. Under the blindness control programme, we are providing free treatment to students and providing free medicines and eyeglasses. Awareness programmes are being held in the district to educate the students and parents about healthy eyes," he said.

Under the aegis of the blindness programme, the Ballari district administration conducted free eye check-up camps in many schools and colleges. During the drive, around 33,000 children were checked. In that 5,800 students have been found with eyesight-related problems. Luckily, most of these issues are in the initial stage.

Raghunath K, a resident of Ballari said recently he got his eyes checked at the government free eye check-up camp. His son, who is studying in 9th standard, also went with him. After finding his eyesight problem, the doctor suggested him not to use mobile phone. "The school teachers send few notes and chapters on phone and it has become unavoidable. We are worried about our children," he said.



Dharwad resident finishes UK cycling event

A resident of Dharwad Rajkumar Khot, presently working in Bengaluru at Siemens Games as a senior engineer achieved fame by completing the London Edinburgh London 2022 (LEL 2022) out and back cycling recently.

From India, around 128 cyclists took part in the event and among these, Rajkumar stood 4th. It is considered as the most difficult cycling event as participants need to cover the distance of 1,500 km to complete it in the stipulated timing of 128 hours 20 minutes.

33-year-old Rajkumar said he completed the event in 108 hours and 5 minutes. He had dreamt of achieving it and he practised for eight years to take part in the event. "It was a well-organised event by the LEL team and Audax UK with over 1,600 participants from all over the world and I am happy to consider myself as the first resident of Dharwad to complete the event. The route was scenic across the UK countryside from London to Edinburgh and back to London. 13 riders from Bengaluru also finished in style, proving they are no less compared to international riders," he added.
