## 28% of CCTVs on Ahmedabad roads not operational



**AHMEDABAD:** About 28% of the cameras installed under the civic body and traffic police's joint project, Safe and Secure Ahmedabad (SASA), are nothing more than road furniture. These cameras do not see and capture anything as they are not connected to the monitoring centre. Under the Rs 314 crore SASA project, the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) has installed 6,200 CCTVs on major roads, of which 855 cameras are yet to be

connected to the Integrated Control and Command Centre (ICCC) that monitors and stores footage on its servers. According to AMC officials, most of these defunct CCTVs are in areas such as SP Ring Road, Ashram Road, the road from Chankheda to Sabarmati powerhouse and 132 Feet Ring Road. In many cases, when a fatal road accident occurs and city police asks the ICCC for CCTV footage, the civic body is unable to provide it because of the defunct cameras.

## 108-day high: 90 Covid cases in city

**Ahmedabad:** The city on Tuesday recorded 90 new Covid cases, the highest in 108 days. For Gujarat, too, it was a 108-day high tally at 165.

With the discharge of 44 patients, active cases in Ahmedabad touched 509 - highest in the past 3.5 months. In Gujarat, the active cases reached 920 with the discharge of 77 patients. Other cases in Gujarat included 19 from Vadodra city, 12 from Surat city, 10 from

Gandhinagar city, six from Bhavnagar city, four from Jamnagar city, and three each from Mehsana, Navsari, Vadodra and Valsad districts among others.

municipal corporation areas recorded 85% of the daily cases in Gujarat. With the update, only 10 out of 33 districts in Gujarat have zero active cases. In the past 24 hours, Gujarat vaccinated 2,078 persons for the first dose and 18,626 for the second.

## Seal 26 highrise commercial buildings sans fire NOC: Gujarat high court

**AHMEDABAD:** The Gujarat high court on Tuesday directed the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) to take concrete action against 26 highrise commercial buildings, including sealing, as they do not possess fire NOC.

The high court also ordered the civic body to take action against 1,128 residential buildings and other 259 highrise buildings which are used for commercial and residential purposes. It has given two weeks' time to the authorities with hopes that the civic body would take concrete action against three categories of buildings and come up with a report by June 30.

Meanwhile, the HC took notice of the state government's survey of 2,160 buildings in municipalities, out of which 1,833 - 84.86% buildings were found existing in violation of building byelaws, without BU permission. The court has asked the government to find out a solution to this issue in five weeks' time.

The Gujarat high court on Tuesday directed the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) to take concrete action including sealing against 26 high-rise commercial buildings that do not possess fire NOCs as they failed to get their fire prevention systems audited in time.

The bench of Chief Justice Aravind Kumar and Justice Ashutosh Shastri ordered the civic body to act against 1,128 residential buildings and 259 other high-rise buildings used for commercial and residential purposes. The court has granted two weeks' time to the authorities with hopes that the civic body would take concrete action against three categories of buildings and come up with a report by June 30.

AMC submitted that its filing of criminal complaints has yielded positive results and there was a rush for renewal of fire NOC by defaulters.

But the court said, "Mere initiation of criminal prosecution or taking action by initiating a process other than not sealing the premises would not yield immediate results." The court said that AMC has got powers to seal the buildings in the absence of valid fire NOCs.

The court further said, "When there are 26 commercial buildings without fire NOCs, it is high time that AMC not only initiates appropriate action to make them obtain fire NOCs but also seals such buildings."

The court said that this was required to avoid any untoward incident or risk to the lives of occupants. "It would be most appropriate for the corporation to prevent such incidents rather than repenting after such an incident occurs," the court added while directing the civic body to take stringent action to make the buildings comply with fire safety rules.

The petitioner in this case, advocate Amit Panchal, urged the HC for quick action because the issue has been at large before the court in different litigations for the past 22 years. He also alleged that the criminal complaints are being filed against a certain set of people.

The AMC informed the HC that of the 10,468 highrises and community buildings, 1,416 were without fire NOCs. It had filed 45 criminal complaints against defaulters till date and urged the HC to direct the chief metropolitan magistrate (CMM) to designate more courts so that the AMC could file complaints against buildings without fire NOCs.

The judges said that they would issue necessary instructions while directing the CMM to immediately look into AMC's request for more designated courts.

The government also submitted that out of 1,362 government schools across the state, 14 were without fire NOCs and 34 of the 78 government colleges did not comply with fire safety rules.

## Gujarat: Fake ads of court jobs posted, 4 held

**RAJKOT:** Four people from Rajasthan were arrested for allegedly posting fake job advertisements for Jamnagar district court on their website.

On April 29, the Jamnagar court's registrar submitted a complaint to the cyber cell informing that a link with fake jobs was in circulation. A woman clerk working with the court had got information about this from her relative who noticed the advertisement while searching for jobs on the internet. After investigating over a month and procuring

the data, police arrested Rajnikant Kathaniya, Krishna Kumar Dahiya, Rakesh Mahiya and Ajay Lamba, all residents of Jhunjhunu district. They had created fake job requirements for security guards, watchmen, drivers and peons and stated that people who had passed Class 8, 10 and 12 can apply. "These four owned a website on which they created fake advertisements for jobs in Jamnagar court. However, no one has been charged till now," said P Jha, inspector, cyber cell.

## Woman, son escape wrath of armed men

**RAJKOT:** A 23-year-old woman and her son narrowly escaped the wrath of nearly 15 men armed with sticks and pipes who intercepted her scooter in Jetpur town of Rajkot on Tuesday.

As the men went to beat the woman, she screamed for help. Two persons tried to intervene but were beaten up by the men. In the melee, the woman Kajal Chavda escaped from the spot. Police have booked Samir, Sabir

and other unidentified persons after the Chavda lodged a complaint. According to police, Sabir harboured a grudge against Chavda's elder sister Rekha with whom he had a verbal altercation a few days ago. When Rekha was going in his SUV, more dung was scattered on the road and clashed on Rekha's car who was going on a scooter. This led to a heated argument between the two.

## Three loot woman's jewellery from home



**Rajkot:** Three men robbed a woman of her ornaments after entering her house posing as Paschim

Gujarat Vij Company Ltd (PGVCL) employees in Bhachau town of Kutch.

Police said the woman Alpa Thakkar was alone at home as her husband, a fire crackers trader, had gone to Gandhinagar and their children too had gone out.

At around 3:30pm, the three men went to her house in Vardhaman Nagar and said they had to check the electricity meter.

While one of them feigned checking, the others asked her to start all the

electrical appliances. When Thakkar went inside the bedroom to start the air conditioner, the three tied her hands and legs and gagged her mouth with a luggi. They removed four gold bangles from her hand along with her gold chain all worth Rs 1.5 lakh. The woman, somehow, managed to scream for help and the trio fled the spot.

"We are scanning CCTV footage to get more clues," said SN Karanjia, inspector, Bhachau police station.

## National Sample Survey from next month

**Ahmedabad:** The mammoth 79th National Sample Survey (NSS) to collect data on various socio-economic indicators is scheduled to commence in Gujarat in July. The year-long project will focus on sustainable Development Goals (SDG) indicators by following the latest Comprehensive Annual Modular survey (CAMS).

One of the highlights this year will be collecting data on the prevalence and popularity of treatments based on Ayurveda, yoga, naturopathy, Unani, Siddha, Sowa-Rigpa Amchi and Homeopathy (AYUSH) among general population by the Gujarat division of National Statistical Office (NSO). In a press release issued by deputy director Jayaprakash Honrao, the NSO will collect data on safely managed drinking water and sanitation services, the proportion of individuals who own a mobile phone or network, the proportion of women having an account at a formal financial institution, the proportion of individuals in the 15 to 24 age group without education, employment or training. The National Statistical Office will organize a workshop to train junior statistical officers and survey enumerators on the new methodology on Tuesday at the National Institute of Occupational Health (NIOH) in Meghainagar.

## Notices issued on PIL opposing Gandhi Ashram revamp

**Ahmedabad:** The Gujarat high court on Tuesday issued notice to the state government, the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation and other trusts linked to the Gandhi Ashram, in response to a PIL filed by the great grandson of the Mahatma, Tushar Gandhi, taking exception to the government's plan to revamp the Ashram. "As the petitioner's advocate was on leave, the court adjourned the hearing till August. However, the advocate general later insisted that the hearing be kept early. To this, the chief justice told the government law officers, "You give an undertaking that you won't touch the Ashram." The HC issued notice after the lawyers for Sabarmati Ashram Preservation and Memorial Trust, which looks after the ashram premises, brought to the court's notice that there are many respondents in this case, but the court has not issued notice. They urged the court to issue notices. The court issued notices to all the parties including the trust, Khadi Gramodyog Prayog Samiti, National Gandhi Smarak Nidhi, Harijan Ashram Trust, Sabarmati Ashram Gausala Trust, Harijan Sevash Sangh, and Sabarmati Riverfront Development Corporation Ltd.

The court posted a hearing for July 5. Earlier, the HC disposed of the PIL on the state government's assurance that it is not going to change the core structure of the Sabarmati Ashram, but will upgrade facilities around it. The petitioner approached the Supreme Court, which asked the HC to hear the PIL on its merits. The Gujarat government informed the HC that the Ashram's present condition does not provide for adequate information about it and the philosophy propounded by the Father of the Nation.

## 'Beware, a female fan may turn out to be a honey trap'



**VADODARA:** Along with courtroom shots and cover drives on the field, young cricketers in the city are also going to learn the tricks off-field on how to duck bodyline throws from uncharted fans, mostly females and bookies.

Under-23 and Ranji squad players will undergo professional training about how to save themselves from glam-coated honey traps by fending off unknown women and bookies trying to bribe them off the field. With the possibility of the young players being played by Indian Premier League (IPL) teams in the future, the Baroda Cricket Association (BCA) has decided to organize a workshop to get them educated on such dangerous mind games.

"While the advent of social gaming apps that offer cash prizes, betting on cricket games has also gone up significantly. Bookies have started betting on even domestic cricket whose scorecards are streamed live on different websites," said Shishir Hattangadi, BCA CEO. "With that the chances of young players in domestic cricket stepping inadvertently into the bookies' treacherous web goes up," Hattangadi, told TOI. bookies' treacherous web goes up. We have had instances where some shady people have tried to bribe the players off the field. And, women may be brought into the honey trap and blackmail the cricketers," Shishir Hattangadi, BCA CEO told.

Players will be warned not to entertain video calls from unknown numbers, nor

share any kind of online or offline chats about their game or field conditions even with friends. Also, they will be specifically taught not to give access to their rooms while touring other cities to any unknown people, not even fans. Players will be given specific instructions not to share pertinent details of weather, wicket, or any part of the cricket ground with any person. "If they find any suspicious person lurking around on the ground or approaching them off the field, players can directly approach our anti-corruption unit representative," Hattangadi said. ## HC asks govt for solution on BU permission issue

**Ahmedabad:** Alarmed that more than 84% of surveyed buildings in municipality areas of the state do not have Building Use (BU) permission, the Gujarat high court on Tuesday asked the state government to come up with an action plan or propose remedial measures in the interests of citizens and the state.

The state urban development department submitted that of 2,160 buildings it surveyed in 24 municipalities of the state, it found that 1,833 buildings were in violation of building bylaws with the absence of BU permission. Most of them are high-rises and are used for commercial and residential purposes. The high court calculated that 84.86% of surveyed high rises in municipalities are without BU

permission. The high court termed this alarming and said the authorities need to draw up an action plan to resolve the problem. It asked the government to place on record its action plan in five weeks.

The chief justice asked the government whether it has a one-time settlement scheme in mind to solve the issue. To this, the government lawyer was non-committal, but the petitioner-advocate, Amit Panchal, expressed reservations and submitted that the government had in 2001 and 2011 come up with a scheme for payment of 'impact fee' for regularization and a law as well, and he had challenged the provisions on both occasions.

He argued that such one-time measures have not resolved the issue so far.
