Bank employees stage protest, discuss nationwide strike on June 27

Bankers in the city staged protest in the city on Wednesday evening and held an assembly meeting to prepare for their scheduled nationwide strike, coordinator of the United Forum of Bank Unions in Madhya Pradesh, VK Sharma said.

They gathered in front of the zonal office of UCO Bank near Arera Hills under the banner of United Forum of Bank Unions in MP and raised slogans against the government and their discriminatory policies. After the demonstration, a meeting was held in which office bearers of the forum VK Sharma, Sanjeev Sablok, Arun

Bhagoliwal, Sanjay Kureshia, Nazir Qureshi and others addressed. The Forum is organising a nationwide protest on June 27. More than 10 lakh bank employees and officers across the country and more than 3 lakh employees in MP will join the strike. The bank employees are demanding a five-day banking week, making all

Saturdays and Sundays as holidays. Sharma said, "Apart from the five-day work week, our demands include pension updation, abolition of national pension scheme (NPS) and restoration of DA-linked old pension scheme, resolving issues quickly and expanding salary revision in Catholic Syrian Bank and DBS Bank (Lakshmi Vilas Bank)."

"The decision of the bank unions to go on a nationwide strike is a forced step as redressal is far from sight" convener of the forum Sanjeev Sablok said. If the bank management does not take our demands seriously even after this, then in the coming days there will be more nationwide strike in the banking industry, he warned.

'PROFESSORS SHOULD FOCUS ON ACADEMICS' DHE commissioner attends NAAC workshop

Member of NAAC General Council and Director of Excellence College, Bhopal Dr Prayesh Agrawal and Director of Administrative Academy Pramod Chaturvedi were also present at the workshop.

Held: Babysitter caught on camera beating toddler

JABALPUR A woman babysitter was caught on a CCTV camera beating a two-year-old boy when the child's parents were not at their home in Jabalpur city, police said on Wednesday. The accused, Rajni Ahirwar, was arrested on Tuesday. Additional Superintendent of Police Sanjay Agrawal said. A clip of the CCTV footage also went viral on social media platforms. The toddler's parents, both of whom are working, suspected something amiss as the child was falling ill off and on and had become physically weak despite the fact that they used to keep sufficient quantity of food for him before leaving home,

the official said. They subsequently installed a CCTV camera in the room where the babysitter used to stay with the child in the house. Later, they saw the camera recording which showed that Ahirwar used to beat up the child frequently, the official said. The boy's mother lodged a complaint against the babysitter at Madhotal police station. Based on the complaint, the accused was arrested and booked under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code, the official said. The child's parents are government employees and had hired the babysitter to take care of their child in their absence, the police added.

Woman boards wrong train, attempts to jump off coach

A video of a woman trying to jump off a train at Indore railway station went viral on Wednesday. The

woman first threw her luggage down onto the platform and then she, herself, tried to jump off on the platform. But an alert GRP personnel at the platform safely lifted her down from the train. People present on the platform tried to stop her, but she did not listen. According to information, the incident happened at 10.40 pm on Tues-

day. According to GRP TI MA Sayyed, Anita Sapre had to go to Bhopal, but she, accidentally, boarded a train going to Gandhinagar, in Gujarat. After boarding the train, she came to know that the train would not go to Bhopal. But, by that time, the train had already started moving. The woman first threw her luggage down onto the

platform then started jumping down from the moving train. According to Syed, the passengers on the train were trying to stop her and her relatives who had disembarked from the train also tried stopping her from jumping. But the woman still attempted to jump by stretching her legs out of the compartment.

While all this was happening, constable Yogesh Khapre, who was on platform duty, spotted the woman. The constable ran along with the train, grabbed the woman's hand and managed to pull her down and the woman survived an almost-fatal train accident. GRP SP Nivedita Gupta has urged that the constable be given an award.

3-DAY ELECTION TRAINING CAMP

151 more govt staff could be suspended for bunking

The threat of suspension lies on a total of 285 government officials and employees. At the training camp for conducting elections in the past two days, show-cause notices were issued to these 285 employees. On Wednesday, IDA CEO RP Ahirwar, who is also training coordinator for the civic bodies' elections, issued show-cause notices to 151 officials for being absent from the training camp that was going on at the Holkar College for government employees for

conducting the elections and other election-related duties. IDA officials said Ahirwar went on inspection of the camp set up at the college and found 151 officials absent. The number has increased on Wednesday's. On Tuesday, 134 employees were absent, while the figure increased to 285 on Wednesday. "If the employees don't respond to the notice with a satisfactory answer or reason, there's a provision of suspending them for negligence in work," said an IDA official.

Ahirwar said that, according to orders received from the District Election Office, the first session of training ended on June 15. From June 16 to 20, the second session will be held. There will be a one-hour examination of the officials on the last day in which they have to pass. The questions will be related to the training. If the officials do not obtain pass marks, they will have to repeat the training session and secure pass marks again. If the officials fail twice, disciplinary action will be taken against them.
