Gujarat HC seeks report on CCTV cameras in police stations

AHMEDABAD: Gujarat high court on Friday directed the state government to submit a report on the status of CCTV cameras installed in police stations across the state. This came after CCTV footage of Vastapur police station was not available, when two women complained of being beaten over a dispute regarding a traffic violation.

The bench of Chief Justice Aravind Kumar and Justice Ashutosh Shastri noticed that CCTV cameras at Vastapur police station were not functioning and video footage was not available with regard to the dispute in which two women were thrashed by traffic cops and booked after being taken to the police station for a traffic violation in January. They were taken to Vastapur police station and beaten. The women complained to the magistrate about the beating and an inquiry is pending against the cops. The women also moved the HC and sought action against the police officials concerned for acting in

violation of Supreme Court orders that women not be arrested after sunset. The arrest was not necessary, and no notice was issued to them before arrest because the punishment prescribed is less than seven years. The arrest memo was silent on the reason for the arrest. Moreover, there was no effort to collect CCTV footage and the women's panchamas were also not conducted. The HC came down heavily on city police and ordered a departmental inquiry against three cops. All three police officials involved in the case, including a police inspector A M Rathod, PSI Vikas Dhokadiya and constable Nilesh Jadhav of SG Highway-2 Division — were suspended, and the government submitted that the department would soon issue charge memos to them. During the hearing, it was submitted that the speed where the alleged traffic violation took place is not covered by CCTV. But the chief justice pointed out that CCTV footage of the police station was not available.

Doctor demands Rs 20 lakh dowry from wife in Pali

AHMEDABAD: A 34-year-old woman from Pali on Friday filed a complaint of dowry harassment and domestic violence against her husband, who is a doctor in Pali, Rajasthan, alleging that he abandoned her and their nine-year-old daughter and demanded Rs 20 lakh as dowry so he could open a hospital. The woman in her FIR with Women's police (west) said that she married a man from Pali in 2011. After their wedding, she began living with her husband in Pali and after that her husband and in-laws began harassing, demanding dowry. In 2012, she gave birth to a girl. This did not go well with her husband and in-laws who kept taunting her and harassing her over the birth of a daughter.

She said her husband moved to Tanjavur in Tamil Nadu in 2014 for higher education and she moved with him. She found out in Tanjavur that her husband had an affair with another woman. When she objected to it, her husband thrashed her. She said in the complaint that as her husband was harassing her and beating her very often, she moved to her parents' place in Pali.

In 2019, she was forced to strike a compromise with her husband, and they began living together in Ahmedabad.

Later, he again began demanding Rs 20 lakh so he could build a hospital in Ahmedabad or Pali. When she refused to ask her parents for money, he thrashed her and abandoned her and their daughter in Jan 2022.

She finally filed a complaint against her husband and four others from his family.

Gujarat high court orders Sidhpur to stop dumping waste in Saraswati river



AHMEDABAD: In order to protect the Saraswati river from becoming a dumping ground, the Gujarat high court on Friday directed the Sidhpur municipality to stop dumping its solid waste in the river and threatened to supersede the municipal body, if dumping of solid waste continues. Acting on a PIL against the municipality's dumping of 10 metric tonnes (MT) of solid waste every day in the river, the bench of Justice J B Pardiwala and Justice V D Nanavati observed that Sidhpur Municipal Corp. had caused substantial damage to

the river. It is not possible in scientific manner to repair the damage done. The court issued orders to clean the river and ensure that further damage is not caused. Beside ordering the municipality to stop dumping in the river, the HC directed Gujarat Pollution Control Board (GPCB) to depute a team to survey the area and submit a report on its condition. GPCB has been directed to keep close watch on the municipality's disposal of solid waste and the Patan district collector was ordered to ensure there must be no further pollution in the

Saraswati. The court ordered the municipality to send its solid waste for dumping to land allotted by the government as a landfill site, and said that not even a morsel should be dumped in the river.

The high court posed a query to the municipality how it proposes to shift the waste to the dumping site from the river. The court has also questioned GPCB what steps it has taken against the erring officials of the municipality. With regard to daily dumping of solid waste, the high court said that the municipality has committed an offence under the Water Act and other laws to curb pollution. A further hearing has been posted for March 25. It is not possible in scientific manner to repair the damage done. Stranded Gujarati students in Ukraine waiting to be airlifted



AHMEDABAD: Nearly 2,500 students from Gujarat are stranded in Ukraine amid Russia's military operation have been told by the local Indian embassy to reach Poland and Romanian borders from where they can be rescued. However, unable to find logistics and resources during these wartime emergencies, the students

have been forced to take refuge in bunkers. In the last few days, the Indian embassy in Kyiv, Kharkiv, Odessa and many other places in the western regions of Ukraine.

Soon after the war began the students rushed back to their colleges and hostels amid piercing sirens and thundering blasts.

Harsh Darji, from Radhanpur, who is a last-year medical student studying and living in Odessa, said, "Yesterday late evening, we heard three to four ear-splitting shattering blasts in the city. Here the local authorities have imposed curfew after 6pm and people are not allowed to go out. The Romanian border is an 11-hour ride away from Odessa. It is impossible for students to travel so far. It will be easier to travel to Moldova which is only a two-hour journey," Darji said that the Indian embassy is struggling off its responsibility to safely bring them to the border.

Gujarati student, Shefali Saraniya, a first-year medical student of Kharkiv National University, who reached on February 7 to Kharkiv with dreams of a brilliant career after completion of her studies there, is terrified beyond

consolation. "Russian border is just 35km from Kharkiv. The hostel authorities have shifted all the students to bomb bunkers where they are providing us with food and provisions. However, hearing bullet fires and missile blasts is terrifying."

Dilip Patel, a farmer from Surendranagar whose son Ronak, also a first-year medical student of Bukovinian State Medical University said, "My son along with others travelled to Kyiv where they were supposed to be airlifted. However, the flights were suspended and they had to travel back to Bukovina. He told us that the roads are badly damaged in the Russian airstrikes."

Patel said that he was informed that two groups of Indian students from Bukovina have reached the Romanian border and will be airlifted from there.

Girl tied, raped in Wankaner farmhouse

AHMEDABAD: A 19-year-old girl was tied up and raped allegedly by a man whom she didn't know in a farmhouse in Wankaner taluka of Morbi district. The police have booked two persons, a farmhouse owner Bhupat Saraniya and his friend (not identified) for assault, rape and wrongful confinement.

Though the incident occurred on February 9, the complaint in this regard was filed by the girl with the Wankaner police station on Thursday evening.

According to the police complaint, on February 9 the girl was working at the farmhouse of Saraniya. In the afternoon, Saraniya and his friend came to the farm and asked the girl about her father.

They also asked for her mobile number. Thereafter, the duo asked who else were there in the farmhouse. The girl replied that she was alone. Taking advantage of the situation, Saraniya's friend dragged the girl into a room. Saraniya also helped him. First, they tied the girl's arms and legs and then Saraniya's friend allegedly raped her.

MBA student accuses youth of sexual assault

AHMEDABAD: A 26-year-old man was arrested after his girlfriend, an MBA student, accused him of sexual assault and cheating by hiding his real identity.

Police arrested Durgesh Rathod who works at a cloth shop, based on a police complaint filed with Mahila Police Station by the 21-year-old woman.

Police said that Rathod was operating social media account in the name of Mandipsinh Anirudhsinh Jadeja. According to police, the woman had met Rathod over Instagram about two years ago. They started meeting each other and soon were in a relationship. On Wednesday evening she filed a complaint against Rathod following which he was arrested and booked for

sexual assault, causing hurt, cheating and criminal intimidation. The woman has alleged that she was sexually assaulted by the accused several times over the past two years.

The MBA student was living in Rajkot alone as her parents had recently passed away. A few days back, the woman was informed about the real identity of the accused. When she confronted him over the issue, they had a fight. She also alleged in her complaint that Rathod had hit her after they had an argument.
