Jahangirpuri connected to CAA-NRC protests: Police

Crime Branch unit of Delhi Police submits 2,063-page charge sheet

IN the most recent development in Jahangirpuri violence, Delhi Police on Thursday submitted the charge sheet in the Rohini court, in which it has been established that the violence was in continuation of the protests against CAA and NRC of 2019 and 2020 in Shaheen Bagh and the riots. The remnants of these incidents further aggravated during Ram Navami this year erupting in riots in different parts of the country.

As per the 2,063-pages charge sheet, 37 accused were arrested, while 8 are absconding. The 37 arrested accused have been charged with offences including attempted murder, arson and criminal conspiracy. Besides, FIR has been filed against two juveniles before the Principal Juvenile Justice Board.

The eight accused who are absconding are identified as Sanwar Kalia, Saddam Khan, Salman, Ashanoor, Ishrafi, Jahangir, Hasmat and Sheikh Sikander. As per the police, of the 37 people mentioned in the charge sheet, 30 are Muslims

Three months on, eight still absconding

As per the 2,063-page's charge sheet, 37 accused were arrested, while 8 are absconding, even after three months since the incident took place. The 37 arrested accused have been charged with offences including attempted murder, arson and criminal conspiracy. Besides, FIR has been filed against two juveniles before the Principal Juvenile Justice Board

and 7 are Hindus.

According to authorities, the charge sheet submitted by the Crime Branch of the Delhi Police also includes the Arms Act in addition to the 13 articles of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

For the investigation, Delhi Police inspected footage of 58 CCTV cameras installed around the Kushal Cinema and C-block of Jahangirpuri. Along with this, 34 viral videos and 56 videos from electronic media were collected and analysed in the Police investigation.

Thirteen teams of the Delhi Police were deployed for the detailed verification of the accused persons, dump data, fa-

cial recognition software technology, as well as cellphone video to arrest the accused.

During the probe, nine fire arms, five live cartridges, two empty cartridges, nine swords and clothes of 11 accused persons worn at the time of the incident (as seen in videos) have been recovered. The police examined 132 witnesses out of which 85 were police and 47 public persons/doctors and others.

The communal violence at Jahangirpuri erupted on April 16 during the procession of Ram Navami. As per the FIR, the violence broke out between Hindus and Muslims when the procession was passing from the Jama Masjid at the C-block of Jahangirpuri. During the violence, few police officials and civilians were injured, while property damage was also reported. Later, the Delhi Police initiated the investigation, which was later transferred to the Crime Branch.

The Rohini court has set for July 28 the consideration of the charge sheet filed by the Crime Branch related to the Jahangirpuri violence.

200 kids rescued from streets in a month

THE Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR) has rescued over 200 children in the past one month under the children in street situation (CISS) project where these children are being assisted with school and anganwadi enrollment.

The commission shared these figures during a monthly review meeting held to discuss the CISS project with the officials of Dialogue and Development Commission of Delhi (DDCD), the Ashoka University and other NGOs.

The meet was held to monitor last month's progress and plan the project's strategy for

the next quarter. After the identification of these children, the dedicated team will monitor their attendance and ensure a minimum of 75 per cent aiming at sustained rehabilitation.

It was in March this year, the DCPCR with support from DDCCD, and non-profits Salaam Baalak Trust and Youthreach India, had launched this project with the aim to deploy a dedicated field task-force for rehabilitation and reintegration of

children in street situations.

The projects also vies to identify vulnerable children and develop them into responsible citizens. The task-force will focus on identifying and providing educational and financial support, and guardianship to street children. Setting up of residential schools by the Delhi government will further strengthen this project's effort to provide street children with a safe environment immersed with learning and socio-psychological support.

This task force team consists of case workers and counsellors who will be deployed district-wise and will work in close collaboration with the Child Welfare Committees (CWCs).

Sharjeel attack: Court asks for CCTV footage from Tihar

A Delhi court has asked for the CCTV footage of the jail cell on a plea filed by JNU student leader Sharjeel Imam alleging assault in the prison cell he is lodged in connection with the 2020 riots larger conspiracy case.

Imam, through his lawyer Ahmad Ibrahim, had alleged that the assistant superintendent of Tihar Jail along with 8-9 convicts had entered his cell on June 30 in the garb of a search, assaulted him and called him a terrorist and anti-national.

Additional session judge Amitabh Rawat has asked the duty register of jail sevadar to be present before the court during the next hearing on July 20. "Let the concerned jail superintendent be also present on the next date of hearing for assisting the court in disposal of the present application. Let the register of the inmates/sewadars, who participated in the said surprise search, as stated, may also be produced in the court on the next date. Let the CCTV footage of all the said three cameras for June 30 for the period 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm be also produced on the next date, July 20," the court order stated.

Through his advocate, Sharjeel had stated that there were two CCTV cameras installed in his cell, while the third one was just outside. He

also said that otherwise he feels safe in the present ward of the jail with all other inmates, but does not know why the said incident occurred. Imam was arrested on January 28, 2020 and will com-

plete two years in jail this week in judicial custody. Additional sessions judge Amitabh Rawat ordered framing of the charges against him.

"Accused is directed to be charged for the offences under sections 124A (sedition), 153A (promoting enmity on grounds of religion), 153B (assertions prejudicial to national integration), 505 (statements conducing to public mischief), of Indian Penal Code and section 13 (punishment for unlawful activities) of UAPA. Vide separate order, the application filed by Sharjeel Imam for grant of regular bail is dismissed," the court ordered.

During the previous hearing, Imam had submitted before the court that there was nothing in his speech that caused religious animosity.

Fire at hotel in Paharganj, 10 rescued

TEN people were brought to safety from the Roma Delux hotel at Paharganj after a fire broke out in room no. 202 on the second floor of the building. As per a Delhi Fire Services official, they received a call around 4.24 am regarding the fire in a hotel at Arakashan Road Ram Nagar at Paharganj.

Subsequently, four fire tenders were rushed to the spot to control the situation. As per the DFS official, ten people were evacuated safely from the second and third floors of the building. Those rescued have been identified as Aditya, 19, Sanskriti, 19, Subham Kumar, 26, Pardeep, 62, Bina Devi, 58, Shweta, 31, Vihan, 3, Arjun, 21, Nitesh, 22 and Partik, 21, fire officials said. No casualty was reported, officials said.

Ritik Kapur, the owner of the hotel told this reporter that it was a minor fire caused by a short circuit. According to him, there was no loss to the hotel property. "When the fire broke out, we safely evacuate all the guests residing in the hotel. For their convenience, we shifted all of them to a nearby hotel." He also said that they follow all fire safety measures.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Central) Shweta Chauhan said, "All the night staff were called at the spot and area was cordoned off. BSES staff, fire tenders and four ambulances also reached the spot."

Delay in medical care to rape survivors: DCW

THE Delhi Commission for Women has issued a notice to the state health authorities over long delays in conducting medical examination of sexual assault survivors at Delhi's hospitals.

The commission said that it assists all survivors of sexual assault through initiatives under its Rape Crisis Cell as well as Crisis Intervention Centre, and provides psychological and legal assistance to the survivors of sexual assault.

The counsellors of the commission - who remain present in the hospitals during the medical examination of survivors to provide them support - have informed that there happens to be undue delays in conducting their medical examination.

"For instance, it took almost 15 hours to conduct medical examination of a sexual assault survivor at the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, 12 hours at the Lok Nayak Hospital and over 8 hours at the Safdarjung Hospital. On an

average, a rape survivor is made to wait for hours for their medical examination at hospitals in the capital," the commission said.

When this reporter contacted health officials, including health secretary Amit Singla, messages and calls remained unanswered.

The commission taking suo motu cognisance in the matter has issued a notice to the health authorities seeking reasons for the delay. It sought data to assess whether resources, both infrastructure and human resource have been allotted specifically for the purpose of medical examination of rape survivors.

Details have been sought of the process followed by the hospitals to give priority to the survivors of rape, standard timelines in which the examination must happen and action taken against the officers if the medical examination is not conducted within the desired time frame. In its notice, the commission has stated that incase SOPs have not been drafted by the health authorities.

Boost NCR's air quality monitoring network: AQI panel

THE Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has recommended strengthening of the air quality monitoring network in the national capital region (NCR) to identify pollution hotspots and assess transboundary movement of pollution.

The recommendation is part of a policy formulated by the panel to curb air pollution in Delhi-NCR. The CAQM noted that there has been considerable progress in expanding the air quality monitoring network in Delhi-NCR since 2015.

The region has a total of 146 monitoring stations at present, of which 65 are manual and 81 real time.

"Nearly a quarter of all the real-time air quality monitors in the country are in Delhi-NCR. However, there is asymmetry in the distribution of

monitors. Most monitors are concentrated in urban centres. While 50 per cent of the real-time monitors are located in Delhi, the remaining are distributed mainly in the four cities of Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Gautam Buddh Nagar and Gurugram," the panel said.

The other districts of NCR have only one real time monitor each. Until some time ago, several districts did not have any monitors at all, including manual ones.

Of the total 65 manual stations in NCR, only 20 have PM2.5 monitors.

"Further strengthening of the monitoring grid in the NCR region requires a road-map. Delhi has a sufficient number of regulatory monitors and needs to focus on quality control of the data and its dissemination. The rest of NCR will require further strengthening of the grid," read the policy document issued by the CAQM on Wednesday.

RWAs slam plan to ban BS-IV diesel vehicles

SEVERAL resident welfare associations (RWAs) in New Delhi on Thursday lashed out at the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) over its new plan to ban BS-IV four-wheeler diesel vehicles in the capital city if the air quality index (AQI) crosses the 450-mark.

"This is a ridiculous policy. When there already is a policy for pollution under control (PUC) certificates and people are constantly pestered to get their PUC done, then why ban diesel vehicles," RWA president of Defence Colony Ranjit Singh questioned.

The CAQM has comprehensively revamped the Graded Response Action Plan -- a set of anti-air pollution measures followed in Delhi and its vicinity according to the severity of the situation.

The revised plan, which is part of a new policy formulated by the CAQM, entails a ban on BS-IV four-wheeler diesel vehicles in Delhi and the bordering districts of NCR if the AQI breaches the 450-mark. Vehicles engaged in essential services are exempt.
