WORK ON WORLD'S LONGEST LPG PIPELINE HITS A SNAG

'Power supply to water lifting pump snapped for want of requisite permission'

One of the most ambitious projects of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, to construct the world's longest LPG pipeline between Kandla in Gujarat to Gorakhpur via Varanasi and Madhya Pradesh, has hit a roadblock in Dewas district.

According to information, the project work has halted as the Sonkatch municipal council has snapped the power supply to the water lifting pump, as the

Kalpataru Power Transmission Limited allegedly lifted the water from the Kalisindh river illegally in the absence of the necessary permission from the authority.

Notably, Kalpataru Power had on February 23, sought permission from the water resource department to take 500-kilo litre water from the hydro test of the KGPL pipeline section passing through a 30.76-kilometre portion of the pipeline in Sonkatch tehsil of Dewas district.



On Friday, following a complaint lodged by the locals accusing that company of illegally lifting water from the river with the help of heavy machinery, a team



project in-charge. Locals have also accused the com-

pany of discharging pollut- ed water back into the river causing harm to the local fauna. Ashish Soni, in- charge water resource de- partment of Sonkatch mu- nicipal council said that company was lifting water from the river without legal permission.

Soni informed that the council had on February 22 already asked the company to furnish a permission letter and as the company failed to produce the per- mission letter, the council team snapped the power supply of the water lifting

pump on Friday. "We also asked company officials to appear before the municipal council with the permission," Soni added.

On the other hand, the company's project in- charge CR Chapre said that they had sought permis- sion from the water re- source department, Dewas and we had a permission letter as well.

It's a government project and we are doing our job here. We have to do a hydro test of pipeline and we sought permission to lift

500-kilo litre water from the water resource department paying its fees of Rs 8,000. "Municipal council has stopped us doing our duty without any explanation", Chapre said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had in February 2019 laid the foundation stone for the ambitious project to construct the world's longest LPG pipeline.

The 2,757 kilometres long LPG pipeline will be laid from Kandla in Gujarat to Gorakhpur via Varanasi and Madhya Pradesh. It will be the longest LPG pipeline in the world.

Scenes send a chill down the spine: Students share live footage

Many buildings in Kyiv, Kharkiv, Odessa turn into debris

Russian forces have advanced deep into Ukraine ravaging Kyiv, Kharkiv and Odessa cities where hun- dreds of buildings have turned into debris, blocking the thoroughfares.

From across the town, comes the rattle of machine gunfire and explosions. A black column of smoke, like a gasping serpent, emerges from the bomb-hit buildings.

Roads lie empty enduring the sings of destruction. This is the scene of the war- ravaged Ukraine, which the Madhya Pradesh students living there shared with Free Press on Saturday.

A red alert was sounded at 4.10 pm (7.40 pm IST) in Ternopil that has, so far, been safe, said Opil Jain, a student who hails from Uj- jain. A curfew was clamped on the town along with entire Ukraine, he added.

The scenes send a chill down the spine. Most stu- dents have taken refuge in bunkers from where they cannot even see what is hap- pening outside. Anjali Venipuri, pursuing MBBS from Kharkiv of Ukraine and native of Harda, said, "They are blasts continuously. I am hidden in the metro station with nine of my friends. My flat is 1 kilometre away from here. We are running out of food and supplies."

"I have been hiding in bunker with my friends for past two days. There are only bomb blasts and sirens one can hear. We dare not move out.

"We emailed our details to the embassy. We have re-

interstate travel here. But I hope they pull us out from the border in time," he adds.

His friend, Satyam Sab- barwal, said, "We are hope- ful. Though our friends and fellow Indians are stuck along Poland and Ro- mania borders, we hope, they're rescued before we reach the borders and we are the next to be rescued."
