## Post PCB order, power supply to Paneer Factory snapped

The Power Distribution Corporation cut off power supply to Jayshree Gayatri Food and Paneer Factory on Peepliya Mira village on Friday, official sources said on Saturday.

According to reports, the Pollution Control Board (PCB) issued an order a few days ago that the Paneer factory was not taking any steps to check pollution.

In the order, it also said that power supply to the company should be stopped and, after that, the power department has begun to take action.

Sudden action by the

power company has shocked the management of the factory.

As the unit deals in milk products, it must have a cold storage. The PCB order came in the wake of villagers' complaints about polluted water being released by the factory.

The villagers were unhappy about the officials' failure to implement the PCB's order, sources fur-

ther said. A few villagers also complained to PCB.

Sources in the factory said that nearly 1,000 farmers are indirectly associated with the factory.

As power supply has been cut off, the factory has stopped functioning, sources further said.

On the other hand, those who were fed up with pollution are now happy.

A filter plant was set up

to release dirty water from the factory into a nearby drain through pipes, but the drain has dried up.

Superintending engineer of the power company CK Panwar said that the power supply to the Paneer factory was cut off after the company had received an order from PCB.

The action was taken according to rules, Panwar said.

## CBI conducts raid in financial fraud of Rs 3.44 crore

Central Bureau of Investigation on Friday conducted searches at the residential premises of Vivek Sharma situated in Pipariya and residential premises of M/s Sandhya Prakash Limited in Bhopal, following an alleged financial fraud of Rs 3.44 crore that came to light recently.

As per an official release, a complaint was made by the general manager of Canara Bank, Bhopal, KJ Shrikanth, the CBI against the borrowers, guarantors and other people involved in the case.

"Accused entered into a criminal conspiracy with a dishonest intention to cheat Canara Bank (erstwhile Syndicate Bank) in a matter of cash credit (CC) facilities, term loan. They cheated the bank to the tune of Rs 3.44 crore by way of siphoning off or diversion of the bank funds for their personal use in 2014-2015," an officials release stated.

"On February 24, 2022, CBI in Bhopal registered a

case under Sections 120-B r/w 420 of IPC and 13(2) r/w 13(1)(d) of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, against M/s Brownie & Sons resident of Sarvdharam Colony, Bhopal,

came into existence and the people siphoned off the money. It is also stated that when the bank conducted the internal investigation and found that the commercial space, which cost Rs 4.96 crore in 2014, was valued at Rs 2.58 crore in 2019.

"On Friday, when the searches were conducted at the office premises of M/s Sandhya Prakash Limited, situated opposite residence of its director in Bhopal, it was found that the premises was sealed by the liquidator appointed by National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), Ahmedabad. The other suspects, accused are on the run and not available at their given address," release stated.



Sunil Tibrewal, resident of Sarvdharam Housing Society in Bhopal, Vivek Sharma, resident of E-8, Bawadia Kalan, Bhopal, M/s Sandhya Prakash Limited (through its three directors) located at 16, Malviya Nagar, Sandhya Prakash Bhawan, Bhopal, and other unidentified public servant(s) and private people," the release added.

The FIR registered in the case states that money taken on loan was misused. The loan was taken to start a pub-cum-restaurant in one of the shopping malls situated in Arera Colony.

## Lack of parking cause traffic snarls

Encroachments in different areas and outside government and private offices in Ganj Basoda city are causing traffic gridlocks daily, commuters said.

According to sources in the civic body, besides encroachments, traffic jams are taking place, since there is no parking lot.

Bikes are parked on both sides of the road from station road to Gandhi Chowk.

Bikers keep their vehicles on the road and go to shops, offices and to other places to do their work, residents said. The bikes are parked for several hours, residents said, adding that many people buy cars but they have no room to keep them, so they keep the four-wheelers on roads.

There are several government and private banks in the city and vehicles are parked outside those offices. This also causes traffic jams. The traffic cops barely bother about manag-



ing vehicles wrongly parked. As shopkeepers have also encroached upon footpaths, commuters are forced to park their vehicles on roads.

Commuters further said that because of long queues of vehicles on roads and outside banks, there are chances of accidents. Several mishaps have already

occurred. Residents further said that the bank managers should take some steps to keep the road outside their offices clear.

Sources in the civic body said that the civic authorities never set up any parking lot in the city, so residents keep their vehicles anywhere.

Residents have demanded construction of parking lots, but the officials of the civic body have never paid any attention to the applications submitted by citizens for parking space.

Four-wheelers and two-wheelers, parked on the road between Bareth and Tyonda, regularly cause traffic snarls.

The officials of the district administration and those of the civic removed encroachments from outside the district court, but encroachers have returned.

## I am still Mahila Cong head: Archana Jaiswal

'People are running misinformation campaign because I am a woman'

"Who says I have been sacked from state Mahila Congress president post. People need to read the letter carefully issued by the AICC. I continue to remain the president," said Archana Jaiswal in an exclusive talk with Free Press.

"Mai jhukungu nahi, tutungu nahi aur apna kaam karati rahungi (I will not bow down, nothing can demoralise me and I will continue to do my work)," she said and asked how come dissolution of the executive body meant sacking of the unit president?

Notably, a letter from All India Mahila Congress general secretary Onika Mehrotra dated February 23, 2022 stated, "It is hereby informed and as stated earlier on 30th January, 2022 that the entire Mahila Congress Committee of Madhya Pradesh stands dissolved until further appointment."

The letter further stated, "However, only the post of four senior vice-presidents continues as of now-Rashmi Bhardwaj, Kavita Pandey, Jamna Maravi and Noori Khan."

Archana Jaiswal was appointed as the state Mahila Congress chief on July 27, 2021 and the executive body of the front organisation was constituted on January 30 this year.

She asked, "Does anyone have any such letter in which it has been written that I have been removed. It is a misinformation campaign against me as I am a woman."

She said dissolution of the executive didn't mean that she had been removed. When the then state Congress president Arun Yadav's executive body had been dissolved he continued to remain the president of the state unit till there was the appointment of the new state Congress president.

However, she added, whatever she was supposed to say on the entire episode she would say on the party forum.

## Gamblers beat up cop, land at police station

The police found 39 cartons of liquor in two different luxury cars late Friday night, official sources said on Saturday. According to reports, a luxury car bringing liquor from Rajasthan for sale in Morena turned turtle on the National Highway number 3 Masoodpur square in the Saraichhaura area. On getting information, a police team rushed to the spot, and when they searched the vehicle they did not find anyone in it, but the car was filled with cartons of liquor. The police said that the liquor was being brought from Dhaulpur in Rajasthan, and that just as the car turned turtle, the passengers ran away with a few cartons of liquor. Similarly, as car carrying ten cartons of liquor was going to Tairni village but the police seized the liquor and the car. The driver and other persons sitting in the car ran away jumping out of the vehicle. The police identified the vehicle owner, a resident of Kukthari village. The cost of the vehicles and that the liquor is Rs 700,000, the police said.

Agriculture scientist Sanjeev Garg has said that stubble burning pollutes the atmosphere, as well as causes infertility to the land and destruction, if it goes out of control.

Garg said that stubbles, if properly used, may increase fertility of land.

Commissioner of Narmadapuram Maal Singh was the chief guest at the function. Managing Director Madhya Pradesh State Organic Certification Society, Bhopal, JP Prajapati, joint director of agriculture Narmadapuram BL Bilaiya and other officials were also present at the function. Agriculture engineer of Pawarkhedha, C S Warkade spoke about the equipment useful for stubble management and the aid given by the government for buying such tools.
