

All voices must coexist

Cinema is not a medium of education. Its prime purpose, first and foremost, is to entertain. Yes, within the magic of storytelling, you could pack in a message or two or something of educative value, but not at the cost of entertainment. Who goes to a cinema hall, pays for a ticket to be lectured upon? My series 'CAT' has been earning accolades for painting a realistic picture of Punjab. But had I failed to engage the viewers, had I not stuck to the tone and tenor of my story, I doubt anyone would have been pleased. For, cinema is the art of engagement and entertainment.

My affaire d'amour with movies started in early childhood. Since my father was in the Air Force, we kept moving from one place to another. What never changed was our weekend forays at special theatres. The projector room fascinated me, and I even started collecting negatives. When my father was posted at Pathankot, VHS had taken over cinema halls and I watched even more movies. In the late 1980s, I was growing up on a staple diet of Sunny Deol and Sanjay Dutt films, and was mighty impressed. Today, without arrogance, but with a certain degree of pride, I can proclaim that I am almost an encyclopedia of cinema. Ask me a question about any music director, lyricist or filmmaker, especially of the 1950s and 1960s, and in all probability, I will be able to give you the right answer. Dare I say, before I became a filmmaker, I was a film aficionado first. I strongly believe that the more you watch, the more you learn and see, the more you learn. Input is equal to output: this is my eternal motto. When I was doing Masters in Economics at Baroda, Internet opened me to world cinema. Italian film director Federico Fellini, Japanese Akira Kurosawa and our very own Satyajit Ray are among my favourite directors. Cinema had to be my de facto choice. How much the three-month diploma in filmmaking from Noida helped me I can't say for sure, except that it gave me the confidence to knock doors in Bombay. As was the norm in the industry, I worked as an assistant to several top-notch directors and learnt the craft. But you can only imbibe the technique, rest you have to master yourself, and your voice has to be distinctly individualistic. Real recognition came with writing the first LIT. I had given writers a clear edge. But when I started, it wasn't the most glorious job on the earth. Yet, later, I met filmmakers like Tushar Hiranandani, who himself is a noted writer but still reposed faith in my writing abilities. Saand Ki Aankh, for which I wrote the screenplay, won the best screenplay writer nomination in the same league as writers of Gully Boy and Article 15, indeed an honour.

Though I turned to production and direction, I simply love to write. Each day, for at least three to four hours, I gather my thoughts and put them down on paper. Writing, of course, is as much about thinking as actually putting the pen to paper. Ideas can float any time of the day or night, while travelling, driving, or even on a vacation. I just scribble my thoughts and distance myself for a few days. If after a week, I still find these fascinating, I go ahead, else I simply junk the idea. The story of 'CAT' had been on my mind, and I do feel strongly about the issues, be it insurgency or the drug menace that I have handled in the series. Some people may think that I have painted the police in dark shades. But that is not true. Look at the portrayal of policeman Babita. In every spectrum of society, there are good and bad people. Common man, too, is not above board. But the police and politicians have a much larger role to play... they are the law enforcers and uphold the law. What they do impacts others. If there was/is no nexus between the politicians and the police, would things have come to such a pass as they did in Punjab? Besides, if everything is good, if all were honest, then there would be no conflict, it would be Ram Rajya. But that is not the case in Kalyug. At the end of the day, 'CAT' is a fictional story, a human story, told with honesty. Though I am being lauded for how I got the nuances right in my series and that being a Punjabi from the border town of Gurdaspur may have informed my creative process.

All in all, the euphoria generated by the FIFA World Cup has evaporated so fast that I find it difficult to imagine that just the other day we were all celebrating the greatest show on earth as million watched the magical final match between Argentina and France. Did the Chinese spectators carry it there? God knows, but the fear of another wave is beginning to haunt governments and people alike. Let us now remember important world figures who passed away this year. The most significant death was that of Queen Elizabeth II, whose 70-year reign marked her as the longest-serving royal. The tragic assassination of Shinzo Abe in Japan was a shocker for the world as Japan (unlike India) has no history of assassinations. Gorbachev, a man who many of my generation remember for restructuring the USSR, went quietly into the shadows this year. Russia was once again in the news after Putin decided to invade Ukraine and pitch Europe into a huge moral and military crisis. The relentless bombing of Ukrainian cities and the sight of refugees fleeing to neighbouring countries has given rise



to another humanitarian and economic crisis that no one knows quite what to do about. Wars and insurrections loom everywhere. Women banned from varsity

Afghan Taliban back to their regressive ways

UNFAZED by the global condemnation of its gender-discriminatory directives that smack of human rights violations, the juggernaut of the regressive dictatorial Taliban regime has been rolling on in Afghanistan with increasing force ever since it regained supremacy in the country in August 2021. The latest decree bans women from attending universities. The first blow dealt to the women took away their jobs and it came immediately after the Taliban wrested power. In March this year, the girls were barred from senior secondary schools; many saw women ordered to fully cover themselves, not move without a male escort and stay at home; last month, parks, fairs and gyms became out of bounds for them. These series of orders paint the Taliban in the same misogynistic and patriarchal colours that they were notorious for during their earlier reign from 1995 to 2001. Their leaders are brazenly defending the patriarchal decisions as being 'Islamic' and fending off global backlash as being 'interference' in the country's



affairs. However, how will they resist opposition from their own women? In the two decades since the Taliban were toppled from power by a US-led military coalition in the wake of the 9/11 attacks carried out by Al Qaeda, the Afghan women have experienced rights and

freedoms under the protective umbrella of the UN, the US and its allies. They were empowered with education and awareness of their rights in the global order of things. This empowerment was manifested in their protest outside the education ministry's office in Kabul in August. While their cries for 'bread, work and freedom' were then muffled by government forces, the saga of suppression and atrocities heaped on the women calls for an international response. Even as other hardcore Islamist countries like Saudi Arabia and the UAE are ceding more space to women, Afghanistan's rulers are stuck in the chillingly austere mould of the 90s and have reneged on their 2021 promise of honouring human rights obligations, including those of women. A recent UNDP report says that women's expulsion from the economy could cost Afghanistan \$1 billion or 5% of the GDP. The Taliban need to introspect on this impending loss.

PM lays foundation stone, inaugurates and dedicates to the nation multiple projects in Shillong, Meghalaya



The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone, and inaugurated and dedicated to the nation multiple projects worth over Rs. 2450 crores in Shillong, Meghalaya today. Earlier in the day, the Prime Minister attended the meeting of the North Eastern Council at the State Convention Centre in Shillong and participated in its golden jubilee celebrations. The multiple projects include the inauguration of 320 construction and 890 under construction 4G mobile towers, the new campus of IIM Shillong, at Dimpasai, the Shillong - Umsang Road which will provide better connectivity to new Shillong satellite township and four other roads projects across the three states viz. Meghalaya, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh. The Prime Minister also inaugurated Spawm Laboratory at Mushroom Development Center and Integrated Beekeeping and Development Centre in Meghalaya and 21 Hindi libraries in Mizoram, Manipur, Tripura and Assam. The Prime

Minister laid the foundation stone of six road projects across the states of Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura. He also laid the foundation stone of the Integrated Hospitality and Convention Centre at Tura and Shillong Technology Park Phase -II. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister remarked that Meghalaya is a state that is prosperous in nature and culture and this very prosperity is reflected through the warmth and welcoming nature of the people. He congratulated the citizens of Meghalaya for the numerous upcoming and newly inaugurated projects ranging from connectivity, education, skill and employment for further development in the state. The Prime Minister drew everyone's attention to the coincidence that the public function of today is taking place on a football field at the time when the football world cup is going on. 'On the one hand, there is football competition going on, while here we are leading the competition of development in the football field. Even though

the football world cup is taking place in Qatar, the enthusiasm of the people here is no less', he remarked. Drawing an analogy to the red card shown in football to a person who goes against the sportsman spirit, the Prime Minister remarked that the government has shown the red card to all the obstacles that come in the way of the development of North East. 'Be it corruption, discrimination, nepotism, violence or vote-bank politics to disrupt the development in the region, we are working with dedication and honesty to uproot all these evils', he remarked. The Prime Minister pointed out that even though such evils are deeply rooted, we have to work towards eliminating each one of them. He further added that the efforts of the government are showing positive results. Throwing light on the emphasis on sports development, the Prime Minister highlighted that the central government is moving forward with a new approach and its benefits can be clearly seen in the North Eastern regions as well. He informed that apart from India's first sports university, the North Eastern region is well equipped with multiple infrastructures like multipurpose hall, football field and athletics track.

He further stated that when arriving at judgement, the primary consideration will be whether the evidence presented remains proved or otherwise as set out in the Evidence Act, and that he wishes, as far as possible, to avoid a situation where tensions in the community arise as a result of the verdict that will be passed. Remembering BJP's Tallest leader Atal Bihari Vajpayee

I remember the first words of Bharat Ratna Atal Bihari Vajpayee when he was sworn as the 16th Prime Minister of India which was certainly more solemn than cheerful. "I have a pledge to redeem, and a promise to fulfill." Vajpayee was born into a high-caste Brahmin family in Gwalior, on Dec. 25, 1925. He was barely 15, but already steeped in Marxism, when a friend took him to a meeting of the Rashtriya Swamanevak Sangh (National Volunteer Service), a neo-fascist organization that has been the guiding force behind Hindu nationalism for much of this century. After entering the politics of the country, he climbed up step by step and now he is the spotless meticulous statesman of the Indian politics. He was the first politician, who addressed the U.N.O. in Hindi on 4th October, 1977. After entering the BJP's biggest achievement; he was the first Prime Minister of India on 25th January, 1992. This was followed by another honor bestowed upon him by the U.P. Hirdi Sanshodhan on 28th September, 1992. And then on 16th August, 1994 "Gandhi Vabshant Award" was conferred upon him for his being the Best Parliamentarian. He was the first Prime Minister of India who is regarded as non-conventional leader of the country. He was held in high esteem not only by his party men but also by other members of the Indian polity. Undoubtedly, he was a great orator. He stood out to be a distinguished man in respect of his choice of words, effective pauses in between, sweet touch of sarcasm and humour, the style of speaking and above all, the quality of judging the moods of his listeners. Vajpayee's



problem was that he proved to be more popular with the 344 million voters than did the Hindu nationalist movement, for which he has been the principal parliamentary standard bearer for 30 years. After coming into power Vajpayee had to face problems but he faced all the problems with courage and sincerity. He took many ups and downs in his political life with great equanimity and bears malice towards none. He was among the very few politicians who knew how to respect the viewpoint of their opponents. The poet turned politician achieved such a successful nuclear Pokhran-2 test, winning of Kargil war, starting of golden quadrilateral national expressway, growth rate of 5 percent or above per annum. Undoubtedly, he was a successful prime minister but the tenure experienced certain failures such as Indian airlines hijack by Taliban, attack of terrorists on parliament and riots in Gujarat. He was a great leader and one of the tallest political figures of India and the world. Even those who have liked his oratory skill and diplomacy. The way he maintained dignity in the Parliament was commendable.

For many observers Vajpayee's successful navigation of what was called an "unwieldy coalition" was his biggest achievement; others praised his optimistic foreign policy while others applaud India's economy under his rule. He was one of the first to voice India's opposition to the unequal Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and he made it clear that his country would sign NPT only when the nuclear power gave convincing evidence of their desire to ban and destroy nuclear weapons. He was also passionate about his desire to "see India take its place as a great nation," with a nuclear weapons arsenal commensurate to its size. He said "We have the capacity for a big bomb now. Ours will be the weapons of aggression." He shared a special relationship with Lucknow, which he represented for a record five terms in the Lok Sabha, before illness forced him out of active politics since 2009. Though he was a staunch and devout Hindu, he was an epitome of Hindu tradition - yet the people of minority communities repose their unassailable confidence in him. In a move led by him, it tried to reach out to the country's 140 million Muslims to assuage their fears of being treated as second-class citizens. Those who have known Vajpayee for years say that by the time the RSS was his alma mater where he had learnt the lessons of life and which had made a man of him. He once wrote, "[The] Sangh is my soul". But as a practical man, he was not ready to be dictated to by the Sangh on every move that he made and every step that he took. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru had once introduced a motion to Winston Churchill as the future Prime Minister of this country who travelled a long way to emerge as India's towering politician, a leader who commanded respect and admiration not only of his party men but even of his rivals, not to speak of millions of his admirers across the world. The man was loved for his qualities of head and heart, his poetry, his integrity, boldness, patriotism, qualities of a great orator, poet, a principled consensus. He was one of the few who can brave the worst travails in life and political career, and came out unscathed. He was an eminent national leader, an erudite politician, a selfless social worker, forceful orator, poet, journalist and indeed a multifaceted personality. He was an ideal for the masses. The message that clearly sprang from his deeds was that even under the most trying circumstances we must never lose our values that have long been our guiding star. As a parliamentarian he had been a member of Lok Sabha nine times and of Rajya Sabha twice. He transformed the Indian growth story. Interestingly the maximum drop in inflation happened during his tenure. He strong will power led to make country nuclear power. His dreams of providing quadruplicate connectivity to India with highways changed people's lives across country. Interlinking Rivers in country will prove a boon for country in removing water scarcity throughout country. His exemplary service & leadership has had a very positive impact on India's growth trajectory. Staying in power for more than 10 years as active politician, both in opposition and the ruling party and retiring from it without any allegation on the character is one rare achievement. From an insignificant political player to a key leader, Vajpayee will be known for his several contributions. From leading a delegation at United Nations to introducing Kashmir issue, Vajpayee has really won the hearts of Indians and even opposition. Vajpayee was an outstanding artist, eminent poet and a true leader who always stood for the cause of the poor and downtrodden classes of society. Employment Opportunities to Unemployed Youth in Jammu and Kashmir

The data on Employment and Unemployment in Jammu and Kashmir is available through Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) conducted by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) since 2017-18. The survey period is July to June of next year. As per the latest available Annual PLFS reports, the estimated Unemployment Rate (UR) on usual status in Jammu & Kashmir was 6.7% and 5.9% during 2019-20 and 2020-21, respectively, which shows that the unemployment rate in Jammu & Kashmir has declined.

Employment generation coupled with improving employability is the priority of the Government. Accordingly, the Government of India has taken various steps for generating employment in the country. The Government of India has announced Atmanirbhar Bharat package to provide stimulus to business and to mitigate the adverse impact of Covid 19. Under this package, the Government is providing fiscal incentives of more than Rupees Twenty Seven lakh crore. This package comprises of various long term schemes/programmes/policies for making the country self-reliant and to create employment opportunities.

The Atmanirbhar Bharat Rojgar Yojana (ABRY) was launched with effect from 1st October, 2020 to incentivize employers for creation of new employment and restoration of

loss of employment during Covid-19 pandemic. The total number of beneficiaries under the scheme, till 28.11.2022, benefits of Rs. 7855.07 Crore have been provided to 60.13 lakhs beneficiaries under the scheme. In Jammu & Kashmir, benefits of Rs. 35.39 Crore have been provided to 19.34 lakhs beneficiaries under the scheme till 28.11.2022.

Government is implementing Prime Minister Street Vendor's Atma Nirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi Scheme) since June 01, 2020 to facilitate collateral free working capital loan to street vendors to restart their businesses, which were adversely impacted during the Covid-19 pandemic.
