

# Jaismine, Manisha cruise to 60kg semifinals

World Championships bronze medalist Manisha Moun and Jaismine Lamboria cruised to the 60kg semifinals with facile victories at the Women's National Boxing Championship here on Monday. Representing Services, Commonwealth Games bronze medalist Jaismine used her long reach to literally pummel Poonam Kaithwas of Maharashtra and notch up a Referee Stops Contest (RSC) win in the quarterfinal. The talented southpaw made good use of her straight jabs to disorient her opponent. She then landed a deadly hook to force the first of two standing counts. Less than 20 seconds later, she landed a strong jab on Poonam to force a second count in round 1. Jaismine continued to dictate terms for the remaining six minutes even as Poonam adopted a defensive approach. When Poonam did attack, Jaismine cleverly evaded the punches by skilfully sidestepping. She will take on Menka Devi of Himachal Pradesh, who defeated Tamil Nadu PS Girja by a 4-1 split verdict, in the semifinals. Haryana's Manisha, who won the bronze medal in the 2022 Worlds, registered a 5-0 win over TC Lalremruati of

Mizoram. Having moved up a weight class for a shot at the Olympics, Manisha began on a tentative note but slowly found her groove as the seconds ticked. She danced around the ring, taking her time to pick out the perfect moment to land accurate punches. She will take on another seasoned boxer in 2018 World Championship bronze medalist Simranjeet Kaur of Punjab in the lightweight semifinals. The 60kg and 66kg weight class are the only two categories where Indian boxers are yet to secure a quota for the Paris Olympics. The top three boxers at the Nationals in these two categories will head to the national camp, where they will undergo assessment ahead of the next Olympic qualifiers in February. Arundhati Chaudhary, the 2021 World Youth champion, made it two out of two for Services as she also made her way to the semifinals in 66kg weight class. Arundhati used her height advantage, landing punches at will while her opponent Komalpreet Kaur of Punjab resorted to clinching. Arundhati did not leave any opportunity to attack to eventually win by a 5-0 unanimous verdict. Reigning world champion Saweety Boora too advanced to the 81kg semifinals with a RSC win.



## It came a bit late but will motivate me: Chirag on national crown

After living in the shadows of his illustrious younger brother Lakshya Sen, shuttler Chirag finally wins the men's singles title in the Senior National championships and he says the crown will motivate him to achieve success in the international circuit. Chirag on Sunday beat fourth seed M Tharun 21-14 13-21 21-9 in the final to win the national crown in Guwahati which Lakshya could never win, having finished second best twice in 2017 and 2019. "It came a bit late but I am really happy to finally win this. I have been playing well for the last 3-4 months but now got that breakthrough. I am looking forward to start doing well in international circuit also," Chirag, a winner of 2020 Kenya International challenge, told PTI. The 25-year-old Chirag, who has been playing in the domestic circuit for the past few years, admitted that Lakshya had contributed in his career growth. "We both share a great bond. It has been a great journey for us as we have been in the academy together, taking care of each other and his contribution is immense in my career," said the world no. 97. "During the Denmark camp, I got a lot of confidence as I was

sparring with him. I got this feeling that I too have the game to beat the top 30 players. It is just that I have to play well during the match." While Chirag won the title, reigning Commonwealth Games champion Lakshya lost to fellow academy-mate Bharat Raghav in the quarterfinals. Lakshya stayed back to support his older brother. "He waited for my final after cancelling his 9 pm flight to Bengaluru. He was sitting behind me along with my dad during semifinal and final and it motivated me and helped me a lot." Chirag will have Lakshya as a sparring partner as he gears up for the Asian tour, including the Malaysia Open (super 1000), India Open (super 750) and Indonesia Masters (super 500). The Uttarakhand shuttler, who started playing men's doubles as well in 2023, said he lost his confidence after facing losses in the senior circuit. "It was about confidence. I was lacking in that earlier. When I started in the senior circuit I had faced a lot of losses and I didn't have any confidence," said Chirag, who will be playing in Iran and Sri Lanka next. "I started playing doubles with Dhruv (Rawat) this year. I trained in doubles and I feel it helped me as it is not usual for others as I have a mixed game."

## Pakistan Hockey could face suspension by FIH

Pakistan hockey could face suspension from the International Hockey Federation after the appointment of a new President of the Pakistan Hockey Federation by the caretaker Prime Minister Anwar-ul-Haq Kakar was challenged by predecessor, Brig (ret'd) Khalid Sajjad Khokhar. In a scene reminiscent of a movie script, the newly-appointed PHF President Mir Tariq Hussain Bugti took charge of the federation headquarters on Saturday in Lahore surrounded by police and his own security guards. Khokhar, who has remained President of the Pakistan Hockey Federation since 2015, told a news conference on Sunday that he would challenge his removal and the appointment of Mir Tariq Hussain Bugti as the new President. "I will be approaching the courts and will not give up until this unconstitutional and illegal decision is changed," Khokhar said. The caretaker PM took the decision to bring in Bugti as President in his capacity as Patron-in-chief of the Pakistan Hockey Federation. Bugti, a former MPA from the Balochistan province, was appointed on Friday but Khokhar said he would contest the decision. The new PHF chief has been given mandate to constitute a five-member committee to deal with the day-to-day affairs of the body besides scrutinising clubs and the electoral college to set the foundation for its 'free and fair elections'. After taking charge of the PHF

offices in Lahore, he immediately restored the old national selection committee headed by Olympian, Kaleemullah and another former stalwart, Shahnaz Sheikh as the head coach of the national senior team. Khokhar had removed the selection committee and Sheikh last month. Khokhar said he is the legal head of the PHF as he is recognised by the International Hockey Federation (FIH) as the legitimate president of the PHF. "I will be filing a court case against the government's decision on Tuesday," he said. "I am the legitimate and elected president and I will fight against this decision till my last breath." Khokhar has faced criticism for his handling of the PHF and tendency to take U-turns on his decisions and is blamed by many former Olympians and critics for the gradual slide in Pakistan hockey. Khokhar claims he has spent his own money and from his friends and well-wishers to keep the federation running. He also claimed that the PHF office in Lahore was "taken over through illegal actions". "I wanted to avoid confrontation but I have now been forced to approach the IOC and FIH," he said. Khokhar has been on a warpath with the government since last year when the Pakistan Sports Board's (PSB) sacked him for not holding the PHF elections. The PSB constituted a committee to hold the elections but Khokhar called a congress of the PHF and held elections himself which led to his re-election as the controversy was put to bed.

## Jyoti eyes spot in India's squad for Olympic Qualifiers

Boosted by her experience on Valencia tour, young forward Jyoti Chhatrati is now eyeing a place in the Indian women's hockey team for next year's FIH Olympic Qualifiers in Ranchi. The 19-year-old was part of the Indian team at the recently-concluded 5 Nations Tournament in Valencia. She has been a key figure in the Junior team setup for the past year and played across all six games for India at the Junior World Cup, scoring a goal during the thrilling 3-3 (3-2 SO) win over New Zealand. She also played a prominent role during India's gold medal-winning performance at the Women's Junior Asia Cup this year. "The preparatory tour in Valencia has boosted my confidence as an individual and I am hopeful to get a chance to be a part of the Indian squad for the FIH Hockey Olympics Qualifiers Ranchi 2024," she said in a press release issued by Hockey India (HI). "This past year has really helped me develop as a player and I am eager to grab on to every opportunity that comes my way. "The senior players, coaches, and support staff have been thoroughly supportive and have helped me a lot whenever needed. It is a dream for every player to represent India



at the Olympics, and our journey to Paris as a team will hopefully begin in January." While Jyoti made her senior team debut at the 4 Nations Women's Invitational Tournament in Barcelona earlier this year against England, the 5 Nations Tournament in Valencia was another good chance for her to compete against some of the top teams - Ireland, Germany, Spain, and Belgium. Jyoti believes her experience in Valencia has helped her grow as a player. "I was elated to be considered for the squad for the Valencia tour. It is always a great opportunity to learn when you get to train alongside the senior team," she said.

"Having competitive matches against such strong oppositions also helped me understand the tenacity and mental strength needed to fight to win at the highest levels." India began the tournament with a 2-3 loss to Spain and a 1-2 defeat to Belgium in Valencia. After losing 1-3 to Germany in their third game of the competition, India recorded a thrilling 2-1 win over Ireland to end their campaign on a positive note. Jyoti said, "While the results were not in our favour on the tour, we could recognise the important areas where we have to focus on and we were able to improve with each game. "It was an important series for

us with bigger tournaments coming up next year. We feel we were able to take a lot from the series, which has helped our growth as a team." India will begin the campaign against the USA on January 13 before facing New Zealand on January 14. Their last Pool B clash will be against Italy on January 16. Pool A comprises Germany, Japan, Chile, Czech Republic.

## AIFF president calls review meeting with Referees Committee

All India Football Federation (AIFF) President Kalyan Chaubey has called for a meeting with the Referees Committee and Chief Refereeing Officer Trevor Kettle on December 31 to review the refereeing situation in the country. A team of referee assessors will also attend the meeting which will also discuss the way forward on the matter. "AIFF President @kalyanchaubey is set to meet the members of the Referees Committee, AIFF Chief Refereeing Officer Trevor Kettle, and a team of Referee Assessors on December 31, 2023, to review refereeing issues and discuss a way forward," the AIFF said.

Refereeing decisions have been a hot topic of discussion in the footballing world recently, and even more so in India, after seven players were sent off in the Indian Super League (ISL) match between Mumbai City FC and Mohun Bagan. Additionally, seven yellow cards were also shown in the match won 2-1 by hosts Mumbai City on December 20. East Bengal had also lodged a complaint about the refereeing decisions in their match against FC Goa in the ISL. Earlier this month, Chaubey had called for better respect shown towards match officials, after a Turkish Super League match was suspended following violence directed towards the referees.
