

State government hikes pending DA of public undertaking and corporations' employees

In a New Year gift to thousands of employees, the State government has hiked the pending dearness al-

lowance of the employees in administrative departments of public undertakings and cor-

porations in the State. According to the orders issued by the secretary, the ben-



efits will be available to the employees drawing the fifth and sixth pay scales as well as

the employees drawing the seventh revised pay scale. The benefit of the increased dearness allowance will be available to the employees from July 1, 2022 and January 1, 2023. As per the orders, the dearness allowance of the employees drawing the seventh revised pay scale has been hiked from 38 per cent to 42 per cent. Similarly, the dearness allowance of those drawing the fifth and sixth pay scales has been increased from 212 per cent to 221 per cent and from 396 per cent to 412 per cent respectively. Along with this, the dearness allowance of the employees drawing the sixth pay scale and who have been receiving the dearness allowance from July 1, 2022 has been increased from 203 per cent to 212 per cent.

Will not hesitate to take necessary action in State's interests, says Dhama

Chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhama has said that the State government will not hesitate even one per cent when it comes to taking action in the interests of the State and its people, whether it be the issue of domicile, land law or any other important issue. Stating that the government is preparing to implement the Uniform Civil Code in the State, he said that the government will soon table it in the Vidhan Sabha. The chief ministers stated this in his message to the public on the eve of the New Year on Sunday. Greeting the people on the occasion, Dhama said that Uttarakhand is moving ahead on the developmental path under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's guidance and that the State government is working in every sector according to his vision.

Stating that unprecedented work is being done across the nation under PM Modi's leadership, he said that citizens are being linked to basic facilities like homes, toilets, cooking gas, electricity and water supply in every village. The government is working diligently on the education, health, nutrition, vaccination and other necessities of girls.



Stating that Ayushman Bharat Yojana has proved to be a boon for the State's people, he said that the State government is ensuring benefit to the people under the Uttarakhand Atal Ayushman Yojana. The e-Sanjeevani telemedicine service has proved very beneficial for residents of distant areas. He also listed various other steps taken by the government to facilitate better public health in the State. Dhama said that an attempt to attract investment in the State from across the nation and abroad in the Global Investors Summit held recently. Memoranda of understanding worth more than Rs 3,50,000 crore were signed during this summit and out of these, grounding of MoUs amounting to more than Rs 44,000 crore has been facilitated. Uttarakhand is going to emerge as a hub of investment, he added. The chief minister further said that in order to encourage religious

tourism in the State, Kedarnkhanda and Manaskhand are being developed. The Manaskhand Mandir Mala mission has been launched to make the ancient and important temples in the Manaskhand (Kumaon) region of the State grand on the lines of Badrinath and Kedarnath. The tourists will get modern facilities with the development of ancient temples under this mission while locals will get employment and the State's economy will be strengthened with an increase in the number of tourists. Dhama said that work is also being undertaken on the expansion of physical infrastructure and transport facilities for all temples and Gurudwaras on the Char Dham circuit.

The chief minister further said that various stern decisions were taken during the past two and half years in Uttarakhand, which could not be taken in the past 23 years. The nation's strictest anti-copying law was implemented and a law was enacted to prevent religious conversion. For the first time in the State, action was taken against land Jihad and about 5,000 hectare government land was freed from encroachment, he added.

New Year to begin with dense fog in five districts

Meteorological centre issues dense to very dense fog alert

The first day of 2024 is set to see foggy conditions in at least five districts of the State. The State meteorological centre has issued an alert regarding the possibility of dense to very dense fog likely to occur at few places in Haridwar and Udhm Singh Nagar districts of the State during late night and morning hours today. The meteorological centre has also issued a yellow warning (watch) regarding the possibility of



temperatures recorded in various parts of the State on Sunday were 22.3 degrees Celsius and 6.4 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun, 17 degrees Celsius and 11 degrees Celsius in Pantnagar, 13 degrees Celsius and 4.8 degrees Celsius in Mukteshwar and 16.9 degrees Celsius and five degrees Celsius in New Tehri. The maximum temperature was two degrees above normal in Dehradun while in Pantnagar, the maximum tempera-

ture was three degrees below normal and the minimum temperature was six degrees above normal. The maximum and minimum temperatures in Mukteshwar were one degree and three degrees above normal respectively whereas in New Tehri the maximum and minimum temperatures were one degree and two degrees above normal respectively.

Meanwhile, foggy conditions prevailed in the plains till late in the morning in Dehradun and other plain areas of the State on Sunday. The foggy conditions have affected the traffic with fog reducing visibility on the highways in both neighbouring Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand especially during the morning and late night hours.

Police act against traffic violations amid New Year's celebration

The Dehradun police towed over 156 vehicles and seized 25 vehicles for traffic violations in the past two days as part of its safety



arrangements for New Year celebrations in the district. The police have been taking strict action against those vehicle owners who obstruct traffic and violate traffic rules. The police on Saturday and till late Sunday evening towed over 156 vehicles and issued challan against the vehicle owners. The police also penalised 15

vehicle owners for violating rules and blocking traffic besides seizing the vehicles, as per the officials. Besides this, the police also took action against 10 vehicle owners for drunk driving and seized their vehicles. The officials said that the traffic police also used drones to monitor the traffic and impose penalties accordingly. The police penalised over 60 vehicles using drones. Besides this, the police also issued 359 challans through the red light violation detection system and speed violation detection system, said officials. They said that the police have installed barriers and deployed police personnel across the district to ensure security and safety during New Year celebrations on December 31 and January 1.

SSP inspects traffic & safety arrangements in Mussoorie

The Dehradun senior superintendent of police Ajai Singh reached Mussoorie on Sunday to take stock of the traffic and security arrangements as several programmes were planned for the New Year celebration there. He checked the police barriers and checkpoints installed on the Dehradun-Mussoorie road. He also interacted with hotel owners and event organisers where the maximum number of people were expected to gather for New Year celebrations on Sunday and Monday nights. He asked them to ensure upgraded safety arrangements as per the rules while ensuring proper parking for the

guests arriving at their respective premises for celebrations. He also asked them to approach the police if they notice anybody who may disturb law and order in the area to ensure people's safety. Besides this, the SSP also directed the police personnel deployed in Mussoorie to ensure all traffic rules are being followed by all. He said that traffic management was quite successful on Sunday considering the number of tourists arriving in the district, especially in tourist spots. He asked officials to ensure traffic is maintained similarly on Monday as many people arrive for New Year celebrations on January 1 too.

STF nabs man on charges of robbing and killing doctor

The Uttarakhand Special Task Force (STF) arrested a man accused of robbing and killing a doctor by slitting his throat in September last year in Haridwar. The senior superintendent of police of STF Ayush Agrawal said that some men robbed and killed a man named Dr Ashok Chaddha in Haridwar's Kankhal area on September 11 last year. His daughter registered a complaint against some unknown accused in the case. The police registered a case under sections 321, 23 and 302 of the Indian Penal Code and started the investigation. It was revealed in the initial investigation that there were six men who killed the victim to rob him. The police on September 15 arrested four accused who were allegedly involved in the murder of Chaddha. These accused were identified as Bhanu Pratap, Sandeep Kumar, Abhijeet and Manish Giri, two of whom belonged to Uttar Pradesh but were living as tenants in Haridwar while the rest were locals of Haridwar. The arrested accused told the police about other two accused known as Shibbu Langda and Deepak Koti who were locals too, said Agrawal. He said that



Shibbu was allegedly the main accused of the crime and the Haridwar SSP had also announced a bounty of Rs 25,000 on his arrest. He said that STF soon started looking for the absconding accused by manually gathering evidence about his hideouts. The SSP said that the STF team finally arrested him from Delhi late

on Saturday after weeks of investigation and planning. He said that the arrested accused was handed over to Haridwar police to take further action in the case after interrogating him. Agrawal said that the authorities are looking for the absconding accused Koti and will catch him soon too.
