# **Punjab CM refuses to display state's** "rejected" tableau during Bharat Parv

#### MoD invites states/UTs to display tableaux at Red Fort; Mann says doesn't require NOC from BJP

Centre clarifies, Punjab's tableau 'not aligned with broader theme'

In a bold and resolute stand against the rejection of Punjab state's tableau for the 2024 Republic Day parade, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Sunday announced that the state's depiction of national heroes would not be relegated to any "rejected category". His strong words came in response to the Ministry of Defence's (MoD) dismissal of allegations of "discrimination" and a subsequent invitation to showcase the tableau during Bharat Parv at the Red Fort.

The controversy began when the Union Ministry of

Defence on Sunday refuted Mann's criticism of the BJP-led Central Government as "baseless", which had excluded Punjab's tableau from the Republic Day parade in 2024. The Ministry firmly rejected the claims, stating that Punjab's proposal failed to meet the required standards and did not align with the broader themes of this year's tableau.

Despite the MoD's clarification, Mann remained steadfast in his refusal to participate in Bharat Parv, stating that the martyrs of the country, including Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, Sukhdev, and Lala Lajpat Rai, do not require a No-Objection Certificate (NOC) from the BJP. Mann emphasized that their sacrifices should not be relegated to a "rejected category", asserting that the Centre is

attempting to diminish their contribution and sacrifice.

Earlier in the day, the Defence Ministry, in its statement, outlined the well-established system for selecting tableaux, where proposals are evaluated by an 'Expert Committee' comprising eminent persons in the fields of art, culture, painting, sculpture, music, architecture and chore-

ography among others. It pointed out that Punjab's tableau was considered in the first three rounds but did not proceed further due to misalignment with the parade's broader themes. The Ministry pointed out that out of 30 willing participants, only 15-16 states are ultimately chosen for the Republic Day Parade, ensuring equal treatment.

### Cold Wave, Dense Fog Grip Punjab: Red Alert Issued

School, Anganwari timings changed; IMD says 'very dense fog' likely to persist till Jan 4

Parts of Punjab are bracing for a frigid start to the New Year, with the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issuing a red alert for dense fog and cold conditions on January 1. The 'cold day' conditions, coupled with dense fog, are expected to impact several districts, including Amritsar, Fatehgarh Sahib, Gurdaspur, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Ludhiana, Pathankot, Patiala,

Rupnagar, and Tarn Taran. The IMD categorizes visibility as 'very dense fog' when it ranges from 0 to 50 meters, 'dense' from 51 to 200 meters,

'moderate' from 201 to 500 meters, and 'shallow' from 501 to 1,000 meters. Current forecasts indicate critical visibility levels, with measurements of 50 meters in Patiala and Chandigarh, and 200 meters in Amritsar. This challenging weather pattern is anticipated

to persist until January 4. In response to the adverse conditions, the Punjab Education Department has announced adjusted school timings, applicable to all government, government-aided, and private schools. From January 1 to 14, 2024, schools will operate from 10 am to 3 pm. Government schools are set to reopen on January 1, while private schools have varying schedules for reopen-

Additionally, the opening time for Anganwadi Centres across the state will also shift to 10 am starting from January 1, 2024, and concluding at 1 pm, lasting until January 14, 2024. Beyond the educational

sector, the Patiala District Administration has also modified the operating hours of sewa kendras, extending from 10 am to 4.30 pm from January 2 to 10. Other districts are expected to follow suit. The state's Health

Department has also urged the residents to contact '104' in case of emergencies or for health-related information. #### Punjab Police bust international drugarms smuggling cartel with 2 arrests

Sharing the information, the state Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav has identified the arrested persons as Sandeep Singh alias Laddi — a resident of Guru Ki Wadali in Amritsar; and Roshan — a resident of Heir in Amritsar.

"Police teams have also recovered 19 kg heroin, Rs 23 lakh drug money, seven pistols including one sophisticated nine mm Glock, three .30 bore pistols, and three .32 bore pistols, along with Pak stamped ammunition, currency counting

machine, and drone equipment including a remote controller and spare fans from their possession, besides, impounding their Hyundai Verna car (PB06BB4064), in which they were going to supply the hero-in consignment," said DGP

DGP Yadav said that preliminary investigations have revealed that the accused persons were directly in touch with USA-based smuggler Mannu Mahawa and were supplying heroin across the State after smuggling from Pakistan. Apart from investigating backward and forward linkages, Amritsar Commisionerate Police teams are also working on the financial investigation on the Hawala links and property details for getting them freezed, he added.

Punjab Police on Sunday bust-ed a cross-border drug and arms smuggling racket being operated by USA-based smuggler Manpreet alias Mannu Mahawa with the arrest of its two key persons from Amritsar.
