

# Punjab CM refuses to display state's "rejected" tableau during Bharat Parv

**MoD invites states/UTs to display tableaux at Red Fort; Mann says doesn't require NOC from BJP**

**Centre clarifies, Punjab's tableau 'not aligned with broader theme'**

In a bold and resolute stand against the rejection of Punjab state's tableau for the 2024 Republic Day parade, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Sunday announced that the state's depiction of national heroes would not be relegated to any "rejected category". His strong words came in response to the Ministry of Defence's (MoD) dismissal of allegations of "discrimination" and a subsequent invitation to showcase the tableau during Bharat Parv at the Red Fort.

The controversy began when the Union Ministry of

Defence on Sunday refuted Mann's criticism of the BJP-led Central Government as "baseless", which had excluded Punjab's tableau from the Republic Day parade in 2024. The Ministry firmly rejected the claims, stating that Punjab's proposal failed to meet the required standards and did not align with the broader themes of this year's tableau.

Despite the MoD's clarification, Mann remained steadfast in his refusal to participate in Bharat Parv, stating that the martyrs of the country, including Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, Sukhdev, and Lala Lajpat Rai, do not require a No-Objection Certificate (NOC) from the BJP. Mann emphasized that their sacrifices should not be relegated to a "rejected category", asserting that the Centre is

attempting to diminish their contribution and sacrifice.

Earlier in the day, the Defence Ministry, in its statement, outlined the well-established system for selecting tableaux, where proposals are evaluated by an 'Expert Committee' comprising eminent persons in the fields of art, culture, painting, sculpture, music, architecture and choreography among others.

It pointed out that Punjab's tableau was considered in the first three rounds but did not proceed further due to misalignment with the parade's broader themes. The Ministry pointed out that out of 30 willing participants, only 15-16 states are ultimately chosen for the Republic Day Parade, ensuring equal treatment.

The Centre, in its defense,

also highlighted the historical shortlisting of Punjab's tableau, which had occurred six times in the last eight years. The Ministry further pointed out that Punjab, along with Delhi, had signed an MoU with the Government of India, agreeing to display their tableau in the Republic Day parade "in one of the three years starting from January 26, 2024...Hence, their criticism of not being selected this year (2024) is not objective and unfounded".

"As states have to be treated equally, it is essential that states should be given the opportunity to display their tableaux as per a formula. Government of India is preparing a three-year programme covering all states/UTs which will be shared with all the States/UTs. Hence, the criticism by these states is baseless," added the Ministry.

However, Mann maintained that the State does not need the Union Government's support to pay tribute to its heroes and accused the Government of attempting to belittle the sacrifices of these great patriots and national leaders.

"The state will not send its tableaux as the martyrs of the country don't need NOC of BJP...Punjab knows how to respect the patriots and martyrs. These are the heroes of the country and the entire country is indebted to them for their supreme sacrifices made for the nation. The state government doesn't need support from the Union Government to showcase their heroes, rather it is capable enough to pay tributes to them," said Mann.

# OTS-2023 scheme launched for Haryana's pending tax payments

**GST Training Institute to be opened in Gurugram**

To settle their pending tax payments before the implementation of GST, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar on Sunday launched 'One Time Settlement-2023 (OTS)' through the Excise and Taxation Department. The scheme will be operational from January 1 to March 30, 2024, during which the businessmen would have an opportunity to settle pre-GST tax liabilities.

Additionally, the Chief Minister announced opening of a 'GST Training Institute', in collaboration with HIPA, Gurugram.

Under the OTS scheme, the tax amount is divided into four categories, starting with an undisputed fee category for cases without dispute. Taxpayers will pay 100 per cent of the amount in this category, with no penalties or interest. For disputed taxes under Rs 50 lakh, taxpayers will pay 30 per cent of the outstanding amount. For disputed taxes above Rs 50 lakh, they



will pay 50 per cent.

The third category applies to undisputed taxes assessed by the department where no appeal was made. Taxpayers will pay 40 per cent if the amount is below Rs 50 lakh and 60 per cent if it's above Rs 50 lakh. This category also offers relief from penalties and interest. The fourth category includes outstanding amounts due to differences in tax rates, with the taxpayers required to pay only 30 per cent of the total.

OTS scheme also provides easy installment options. Taxpayers with outstanding amounts below Rs 10 lakh must pay the entire sum in one lump sum before March 30. For Rs 10 lakh to Rs 25 lakh, the amount can be paid in two

installments of 52 per cent each. If the outstanding is more than Rs 25 lakh, the payment can be spread across three installments: 40 per cent in the first 90 days, 30 per cent in the next 90 days, and 30 per cent in the final 90 days.

The Scheme also addresses outstanding tax issues from the Excise and Taxation Department until June 30, 2017.

The Chief Minister also announced the expansion of Urban Ownership Scheme — an initiative granting ownership rights to shopkeepers occupying local body land. This expansion will now encompass shopkeepers who pay rent to the local body for their shops built on land managed by various departments.

# HP Govt initiates affordable access to quality horticulture supplies

In a significant move to empower apple growers and boost the state's horticulture sector, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Sunday announced that the Himachal Pradesh Government will provide quality horticulture equipment, fertilizers, and pesticides at affordable rates through the Himachal Pradesh Horticulture Produce Marketing and Processing Corporation (HPMC) starting January 1, 2024.

Expressing the Government's dedication to the welfare of apple growers, the Chief Minister highlighted that HPMC has reduced its margin from 15 to nine per cent. This reduction is aimed at making quality agricultural products more economically accessible to the state's apple growers, contributing to their overall prosperity, he said.

To ensure direct access to essential items at competitive rates, HPMC has entered into 38 Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with original manufacturing companies — a strategic initiative aimed to cut intermediary costs and enable farmers to procure vital supplies at more affordable prices.

"Our Government is committed to supporting apple growers, and the decision to reduce margins reflects our dedication to uplifting the horticultural community and enhancing the economic well-being of apple growers in Himachal as our top priority," said Sukhu.

Underscoring the Government's commitment to systemic reform, he emphasized that every decision is geared towards public welfare and the holistic development of the state. The Government aimed to increase the income of horticulturists, and the Horticulture Department will revamp existing schemes for greater effectiveness through suitable restructuring.

In a forward-looking approach, the Government has allocated funds in its first budget to establish an online system facilitating the procurement of horticulture produce at the minimum support price by HPMC. This online facility will extend to booking Controlled Atmosphere (CA) stores of HPMC, offering farmers a streamlined and tech-enabled process for various transactions.

Chief Minister Sukhu also revealed plans for the establishment of grading or packing houses, CA, and cold stores in collaboration with Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) across strategically selected locations in the State, including Bhavanagar in Kinnaur, Sandasu near Chirgaon, Anu in Jubbil, Chopal in Shimla, Jabli in Solan district, Sundernagar in Mandi, Duttanagar near Rampur Bushehar, and Kharapathar in Shimla.

Reflecting on the successful sale of apples at a per-kilogram rate in the current year, Chief Minister Sukhu assured that the upcoming season would witness a streamlined process with apples packed in universal cartons, meeting a

long-pending demand of apple growers and ensuring increased profits.

## UT Estate Office to launch online portal for grievance redressal today

UT-Chandigarh Estate Office is set to revolutionize its grievance redressal mechanism with the launch of a dedicated online portal.

The move came in the wake of challenges faced by certain applicants during the Grievance Redressal camps held on December 16 and 17. Developed by the National Informatics Centre, UT Chandigarh, the portal promises a user-friendly experience, offering a relief mechanism with just a click. Notably, grievances submitted through the portal will be monitored at the highest authority level in the Estate Department, ensuring a swift and effective resolution process.

Applicants can expect their grievances to be promptly forwarded to the relevant branch for redressal, with notifications sent to keep them informed of the progress.

## Cold Wave, Dense Fog Grip Punjab: Red Alert Issued

**School, Anganwari timings changed; IMD says 'very dense fog' likely to persist till Jan 4**

Parts of Punjab are bracing for a frigid start to the New Year, with the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issuing a red alert for dense fog and cold conditions on January 1. The 'cold day' conditions, coupled with dense fog, are expected to impact several districts, including Amritsar, Fatehgarh Sahib, Gurdaspur, Hoshiarpur, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Ludhiana, Pathankot, Patiala, Rupnagar, and Tarn Taran.

The IMD categorizes visibility as 'very dense fog' when it ranges from 0 to 50 meters, 'dense' from 51 to 200 meters,

'moderate' from 201 to 500 meters, and 'shallow' from 501 to 1,000 meters. Current forecasts indicate critical visibility levels, with measurements of 50 meters in Patiala and Chandigarh, and 200 meters in Amritsar. This challenging weather pattern is anticipated to persist until January 4.

In response to the adverse conditions, the Punjab Education Department has announced adjusted school timings, applicable to all government, government-aided, and private schools. From January 1 to 14, 2024, schools will operate from 10 am to 3 pm. Government schools are set to reopen on January 1, while private schools have varying schedules for reopening.

Additionally, the opening time for Anganwadi Centres across the state will also shift to 10 am starting from January 1, 2024, and concluding at 1 pm, lasting until January 14, 2024.

Beyond the educational

sector, the Patiala District Administration has also modified the operating hours of sewa kendras, extending from 10 am to 4.30 pm from January 2 to 10. Other districts are expected to follow suit.

The state's Health Department has also urged the residents to contact '104' in case of emergencies or for health-related information. Furthermore, the Fisheries Department has issued a special advisory for fish farmers, emphasizing the need for precautions during the cold and foggy weather. Recommendations include maintaining water levels at six-seven feet, adjusting fish feed based on temperature, and using oxygen tablets or powder.

As Punjab grapples with this winter weather, the state remains resilient, implementing necessary adjustments to daily activities to ensure the safety and well-being of its residents.
